 - 1. Good advice comes from Good people.

- B. The Corinthians and Macedonians were successful in giving to the poor saints.
 - They were subjects of Paul's boasting. v24
 - 2. How were they successful?
 - 3. How did they do the work of God?
- I. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD WILLINGLY. V12
 - A. The willing heart makes anyone successful.
 - 1. You cannot fail no matter your resources.
 - 2. We fail when we refuse to try.
 - B. The will is the womb of success.
 - 1. If a person is unwilling, he will not succeed.
 - 2. He may inherit another's success.
- II. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD EQUALLY. V13-15
 - A. This equality does not imply percentages.
 - equality = isotes equality, equal state, proportional.
 - eased = anesis a letting loose, relaxation.
 - B. When we have an abundance we should share.
 - Those in need will someday be in abundance and they will help us.
 - C. Enough is enough. v15

III. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD SINCERELY. V16,17

- A. Titus had earnest care for them.
 - spoude haste, speed, readiness; zeal, pains, trouble, an earnest, serious purpose.
 - 2. "of his own accord he went unto you."
- B. God put this in Titus' heart.
 - But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you."
 - 2. I John 3:16-18.

IV. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD CORPORATELY. V18-19

- A. The churches worked together.
 - 1. There was no need for permanent organization.
 - Committee on poverty.
 - 3. Where there is willingness, things will be done.
- B. They chose a man to administer the funds.
 - chosen = cheirotoneo to stretch out the hand, to chose by vote or suffrage.
 - Churches may work together without excessive organization.
 - The only religious organization that can claim permanent organization is the church.

V. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD HONESTLY. V20-21

- A. When money is handled there may be charges of dishonesty
 - avoiding = stellomai to furl or short the sail, when coming to shore or in order to avoid danger in navigation.
 - blame = momaomai to find fault, criticize.

- B. Money should be handled with two things in mind. v21
 - 1. "sight of the Lord."
 - 2. "sight of men."
- C. Honesty of this nature is comely.
 - honest = kalos = beautiful, comely, noble.
 - providing = proneo to provide for on one's own behalf.

VI. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOD DILIGENTLY. U22

- A. "our brother, whom we have oftentimes proved diligent in many things."
 - 1. diligent = spoudazo to make haste, do the utmost.
 - 2. He proved himself oftentimes.
- B. Here was a brother who grained the reputation of getting things done.
 - 1. When such men exist, thank God for them and let them get things done!

VII. THEY DID THE WORK OF GOT BROTHERLY. V23-24

- A. The relationship Titus to Paul.
 - 1. partner = koinonos a sharer in common.
 - fellowhelper = sunergos fellow-worker.
- B. Their relationship to the churches.
 - messengers = apostolos an official envoy, the one who delivers the collection.
 - "glory of Christ." = they bear that which is a glory to Christ.
- VIII. THESE ARE WORKABLE CHARACTERISTICS FOR GOD'S PEOPLE IN ANY AGE.
 - A. Willingness, Equality, Sincerity, Co-operation, Honesty, Diligence, Brotherly love.
