MINISTERS OF THE NEW TESTAMENT II COR. 4:1-4

Introduction:

- A. Preachers of this age are ministers of the New Testament. v3:6.
 - 1. Able ministers. qualified.
 - 2. "not of the letter, but of the spirit."
- B. We are qualified messengers of God, whose message gives life to those who believe.
 - 1. 2:16.
 - 2. We are not priests of condemnation.
- C. This ministry presented stress.
 - 1. "and who is sufficient for these things?"
 - 2. Aaron was called, any error could condemn.
- D. God aided in this ministry.
 - 1. 3:5.
 - 2. Paul believed that God could enable him.
- I. GOD'S PEOPLE HAVE A MINISTRY. VI
 - A. "therefore seeing we have this ministry."
 - "we faint not."
 - a. faint = ekkakeo to lose one's courage.
 - 2. "as we have received mercy."
 - B. Specifically the church was given the commission.
 - 1. Matt. 28:18-20.
 - 2. God calls men to preach and pastor.
 - 3. All have "this ministry."
- II. THREE THINGS THAT DESTROY THE MINISTRY OF LIGHT. U2a
 - A. "hidden things of dishonesty."

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- 1. renounced = apeipon to speak off, disown.
- hidden = Kruptos covered for purposes of concealment.
- dishonesty = aischune shame, a sense of disgrace.
- B. "walking in craftiness."
 - 1. walking = peripateo to tread about.
 - craftiness = panourgia shrewdness, unscrupulous conduct.
- C. "handling the word of God deceitfully."
 - handling deceitfully = doloo to deceive especially by a bait, hence to falsify, to corrupt.
 - Lost people can understand the Bible, who could be saved.
- D. II Cor. 2:17.
 - 1. Acts 17:10.

III. THE TRUE MINISTRY IS A MINISTRY OF TRUTH. V2b

- A. "but by manifestation of the truth."
 - 1. manifestation = phanerosis a making known.
 - 2. truth = aletheia the veritable essence of a matter
- B. The truth appeals to man's conscience.
 - "commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God."
 - a. commending = sunistemi to introduce to one's acquaintance and favorable notice, to represent as worthy.
 - b. conscience = suneidesis a knowing of ones self, the being ones own witness, the testimony of one's own conduct.

- A. Men are lost.
 - 1. v3.
 - 2. "them that are lost."
- B. "But if our gospel be hid."
 - 1. hid = druptos = covered for purposes of concealment.
 - 2. Matt. 13:14-16.
- C. "it is hid to them that are lost."
 - 1. There are none so blind as those who refuse to see.
- U. THE ADVERSARY OF THE MINISTRY OF LIGHT. V4
 - A. "In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not."
 - 1. "the god of this world."
 - 2. Jesus is not Lord over Little Rock!
 - blinded = tuphloo to blind, from root, tuph to burn, smoke; the dulling of the intellect.
 - B. "lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them."
 - light = photismos a lighting, il·lumination, shining.
 - glorious = dokses = of glory (same as v8)
 - imgae = eikon the pattern, the original.
 - 4. shine = augazo to view in the clearest light, see distinctly, discern; of the sun to beam upon.
 - C. The gospel is hid from lost because of the smoke screen that Satan has thrown up.
 - 1. If they want to see, they can.
 - 2. If they want to hear, they can.
