 - gladly = hedeos sweetly, with relish of eating, with pleasure.

 - B. They said he walked according to the flesh.
 - 1. v10:2.
 - C. They said his body presence was weak.
 - 1. v10:10.
 - D. They said his speech was contemptible.
 - 1. v10:10.
 - E. He preached to them without charge.
 - 1. v11:7.

 - F. He took money from other churches. v8.
 - 1. robbed = sulao to spoil, to plunder, rob.
 - 2. wages = spsonion = a stipend, wages, esp. of solders
 - G. He was chargeable to no man. v9a
 - charageable = Katanarkao to be burdensome to anyone.
 - I. He boasted of his independence of them.
 - "and in all things I have Kept myself from being burdensome unto you."
 - a. burdensome = narke effect of electric eel, to become numb.
 - J. He loved them. v11
 - 1. Why would Paul be so critical?
 - 2. If you loved me you wouldn't spank me.
 - K. Paul defended his actions. v12
 - 1. This often times angers people.
 - 2. Jesus didn't, he was not in the flesh.
