PAUL PLANS ANOTHER VISIT TO CORINTH II COR. 12:13-21

Introduction:

- A. Paul planned to make another visit to Corinth.
 - 1. v14, "Behold, the third time I am ready to come to you."
 - 2. "This is the time I am coming to you." v13:1.
- B. This seems to be a foolish plan.
 - 1. He has been the object of ridicule.
 - Some seek to disgrace and discredit him.
- C. What are some of his thoughts?
 - 1. Will he allow them to support him?
 - 2. What will he do to the false apostles?
- I. PAUL REMEMBERS THEIR FAILURE TO SUPPORT HIM. V13
 - A. It made them inferior to other churches.
 - 1. inferior = hettaomai to be less or weaker.
 - burdensome = Katanarkao narcotic, to be limp, as when hit by an electric eel.
 - B. It was a wrong.
 - wrong = adikia = the opposite of what is right.
 - 2. Paul asked for their forgiveness in allowing them to continually not support him.
- II. HE HAS DETERMINED TO CONTINUE HIS INDEPENDENCE. V14
 - A. "and I will not be burdensome to you."
 - burdensome = Katanarkao narcotic.
 - Paul would not allow them to support him because these people would always misinterpret such action.
 - B. What reasons will he use?

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- 1. "I seek not yours but you."
- 2. "The children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children."
- I Cor. 4:14, "Not to shame, but as my beloved sons, to warn you."
- C. He was willing to spend his own money. v15
 - 1. "And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you."
 - a. spend = dapanao to be an expense, use up.
 - b. spent = ekdapanaomai to spend entirely.
 - c. gladly = hedeos with genuine pleasure.
- D. Their unexplainable reaction.
 - "though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved."
 - 2. What is unearned is often despised.
 - a. Rich bestowing gifts on children.

III. THE ULTIMATE INSULT TO PAUL. V16-18

- A. Some argued that although Paul had not been personally supported by them, he practiced deceit and sent others to collect money for him.
 - 1. "But be it so, I did not burden you."
 - a. crafty = panourgos doing or ready to do anything, hence, shrewd, cunning.
 - b. quile = dolos a bait for fish, cunning devise.
- B. None of the men Paul sent took pay.
 - 1. v17.
 - 2. Titus did not make a gain of them.
 - 3. v18.
- IV. PAUL'S MOTIVES WERE TO EDIFY, NOT APOLOGIZE. V19
 - A. "Again, think ye that we excuse ourselves unto you."
 - excuse = apologeomai to plead for one's self,
 defend one's self before a tribunal.

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- 2. Are you thinking all this time that I am trying to justify myself in your eyes?
- B. "We speak before God in Christ."
 - 1. Actually I am speaking in Christ before God.
 - 2. He knew that God would judge him.
- C. *but we do all things, dearly beloved, for your edifying
 - 1. Paul did not suffer for his benefit.
 - 2. He did not defend himself for his good.
- V. THE THINGS PAUL WAS AFRAID HE WOULD FIND AT CORINTH. V20,21
 - A. "For I fear, lest, when I come, I shall not find you such as I would, and that I shall be found unto you such as ye would not."
 - debates = eris rivalry, word-wrangling, dispute.
 - envyings = zeloo to be zealously for or against anybody.
 - 3. wraths = thumos the demonstration of strong passion, which may issue in anger, the spirit that is breathed out.
 - 4. strifes = eritheia = labour for wages; hence canvassin, party-spirit, faction.
 - backbitings = katalalia a speaking against, open evil speaking as opposed to whispering.
 - 6. whisperings = psithurismos to say in the ear, esp, to whisper what one dares not speak of secret slandering.
 - swellings = phusiosis a puffing up, inflation.
 - 8. tumults = akatastasia instability, disorder.
 - B. "And lest, when I come again, my God will humble me among you, and that I shall bewail many which have sinned already, and have not repented of the uncleaness and fornication and lasciviousness which they have committed."

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- 1. "I am afraid lest, on my next visit, my God may humble me in regard to you, and that I may have to mourn over many who have long been sinning, and have not repented of the impurity, immorality, and sensuality, in which you have indulged." TCNT
- 2. The sins they continually practice.
 - a. uncleaness = akatharsia impurity in general.
 - b. fornication = porneia.
 - lasciviousness =aselgeia excess, immoderation in anything.

VI. IF PAUL VISITED THIS CHURCH, WHAT WOULD HE FIND?

- A. The eight things mentioned above? v20
 - Debates, Envyings, Wraths, Strifes, Backbitings, Whisperings, Swellings, Tumults.
- B. The three sins of the flesh? v21.
 - Uncleaness, Fornication, Lasciviousness.
