PAUL'S FEAR FOR THE CORINTHIAN CHURCH II COR. 11:1-6

Introduction:

- A. Paul states in verse 3 that he has a fear concerning the church.
 - 1. "But I fear."
 - 2. fear = phobeomai to fear, to be afraid.
- B. He did not fear them but what might happen to them.
 - 1. They did not regard his advise very highly. v1
 - 2. folly = aphrosume = destitute of sound principles.
- C. What specifically did Paul fear?
 - 1. Their relationship to Christ would be hindered.
 - 2. The truth of God corrupted.

I. THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE CHURCH TO CHRIST. V2

- A. "For I am jealous over you with a godly jealousy."
 - zelos = zeal, to be jealous, to have a passion for another.
 - This was godly jealousy, it was not a fear for Paul but for the church.
- B. "for I have espoused you to one husband."
 - espoused = armozo to fit, to join, of marrying or giving in marriage.
 - It is not critical to the interpretation whether Paul means engaged or married.
 - a. Exogamous b. Monogamous c. Polyagomous
 d. Monogamous.
 - The emphasis is on one husband.
 - 4. We must not mix figures of speech.
 - 5. "Bride of Christ," "Body of Christ."
- C. "that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ."

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- present = paristemi to cause to stand beside.
- chaste = hagnos = holy, sacred, undefiled.
- "to Christ," not to any other.

II. PAUL FEARED THAT THE CHURCH WOULD BE CORRUPTED. V3b

- A. "So your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ."
 - minds = noema = the product of the action of the nous, purpose, that which is thought out.
 - 2. corrupted = phtheiro to spoil.
 - simplicity = aplotes = singleness, plainess, always opposite to duplicity.
- B. The manner of their temptation. v3a.
 - 1. "as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtility."
 - 2. beguiled = eksapatao to cheat, to deceive.
 - subtility = panourgia unscrupulous conduct,
 villiany, tricks.
 - 4. "as the serpent," sophisticated arguments.
- C. Who would do such a thing?
 - 1. v13-15.

III. THE MESSAGE THAT WOULD CORRUPT THE CHURCH. V4

- A. "preaching another Jesus, whom we have not preached."
 - 1. It would be complicated, not simple.
 - 2. This was the same historical Jesus.
 - 3. It was a change in his work.
 - 4. "one Lord," "One Mediator."
- B. "receiving another spirit, which ye have not received."
 - 1. Eph 4:4, "There is one body, and one spirit."
 - 2. How to identify the true Spirit?
 - a. Speaks of Jesus Christ.
 - b. Never contradicts the Bible.

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- C. "accepting another gospel which ye have not accepted."
 - 1. The gospel is something they accepted, not did.
 - 2. Paul identified the gospel. I Cor. 15:1-4.
 - Paul warned the Galatians about another gospel.
 a. Gal. 1:6-9.

IV. PAUL'S INFERIORITY TO THE FALSE APOSTLES. V5

- A. Paul refers to them as super-apostles. v5
 - 1. "For I suppose I was not one whit behind the very chiefest of apostles."
 - For I consider not myself a single bit inferior to those surpassingly superior apostles of yours.
- B. He was rude in speech! vó
 - "For though I be rude in speech, yet not in Knowledge."
 - 2. idiotes, = a private citizen, opp. to one in a public station; as individual, opp. to the many; one who has no professional knowledge, whether of politics or any other subject, as we say, a layman. Then gen., un-informed, ignorant.
- C. Paul had been open in his life-style.
 - 1. "but we have been thoroughly made manifest among you in all things."
 - At all times we have made known to you the full truth.

V. ARE WE SUBJECT TO THE SAME TEMPTATIONS?

- A. We have the same relationship, as a church.
 - 1. We have been espoused to one husband.
 - 2. Does this have meaning to us?

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- B. We have the same truths.
 - 1. They may be corrupted.
 - 2. The same, Jesus, the same gospel, the same Spirit.
- C. We have the same flesh.
 - 1. Our flesh can fail.
 - 2. Our flesh cannot be trusted.
- D. We have the same potentials for good.
 - 1. Did they do good?
 - 2. They had some good members.
 - 3. They were willing to learn and change.
- E. We have the same potentials for evil.
 - Everything is present here for us to become as the Corinthians.
