- B. Paul wanted them to love him in the same way he loved them.
 - 1. I love you with a big-hearted love.
 - 2. Enlarge your hearts.
- I. PAUL AFFIRMS HIS LOVE TO THE CHURCH. V11
 - A. He addresses them by name.
 - 1. "O (ye) Corinthians."
 - 2. His passion is displayed in his statement.
 - B. He speaks freely.
 - "our mouth is opened unto you."
 - 2. We are willing to instruct you.
 - C. His love was from a large heart.
 - "our heart is enlarged."
 - platuno to widen, to extend.
- II. THE CHURCH HAD NOT SO LOVED PAUL. V12
 - A. "ye are not straitened in us."
 - 1. My heart is big, it is not restricted.
 - 2. There is no narrowness in my love for you.
 - B. "but ye are straitened in your own bowels."
 - 1. You are narrow in your love for me.
 - 2. Your narrow heart restricts your love.

III. PAUL'S PLEA FOR BIGGER HEARTS. V13

- A. Love from a big heart can only be returned by a big heart.
 - 1. "now for a recompense in the same."
 - 2. Now for a fair exchange.
- B. Paul loved them with a father's love.
 - 1. "I speak as unto my children."
 - 2. Such talk would be:
 - a. Frank.
 - b. Fair.
 - c. Truthful.
 - d. and in their best interest.
- C. "be ye also enlarged."
 - Let your hearts be wide and open to receive and return my love.

 - A. The things love will and will not do.
 - 1. I Cor. 13:4-8.
 - B. Hearts we must avoid.
 - 1. Small hearts.
 - 2. Stony hearts.
 - 3. Deceitful hearts.
