## THE POWER OF REPENTANCE II COR. 7:8-11

## Introduction:

- A. The opening of the New Testament age began with a call to repentance.
  - 1. "Repent ye, for the lingdom of heaven is at hand."
  - 2. Preached by John and Jesus.
- B. Repentance is a necessary religious experience.
  - 1. Israel was challenged to repent, Jew.
  - Nineveh was called to repent, Gentile.
- C. Paul had written to the church at Corinth and called them to repentance.
  - They had tolerated an incestous relationship to exist in the church.
  - 2. "his father's wife."
  - 3. This letter had, "made them sorry."
    - a. v8.
    - b. sorry = lupeo to cause pain, to make sorry.
    - c. season = horan for an hour.

## I. WHAT IS REPENTANCE? V9-10

- A. It is more than being sorry.
  - "Now I rejoice, not that you were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance."
- B. It is connected with God.
  - \*for ye were made sorry after a godly manner."
  - 2. You felt pain in the way of God's will.
  - 3. What Paul wrote did not damage them.
    - a. "that ye might receive damage by us in nothing."
- C. True repentance brings people to a relationship with God. v10

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- "For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation, not to be repented of."
- 2. This is not true of false repentance.
  - a. "but the sorrow of the world worketh death."

## II. THE POWER OF REPENTANCE. V11

- A. They had repented.
  - "for behold this selfsame thing, that ye sorrowed after a godly sort."
- B. Seven definite results of their repentance.
  - carefulness = spoude an earnest and serious purpose.
  - clearing of yourselves = apologia a speech in defense, verbal defense.
  - 3. indignation = aganaKtesis physical pain, because of the shame brought on the church.
  - 4. fear = phobos fear, (of God).
  - 5. vehement desire = epipothesis longing.
  - zeal = zelos stirred up.
  - 7. revenge = ekdikesis vengeance, punishment, perhaps beringing the guilty to justice.
- C. It had all worked.
  - 1. "In all things ye have approved your selves to be clear in this matter."
  - You have completely wiped away reproach from yourselves in this matter.
