PREACHING THE GOSPEL THERE Acts 14:1-7

Introduction:

- A. There is a great truth emerging from this tudy of the book of Acts
 - 1) The early church preached the word of God
 - We see this continually
 - 3) 11:19,20; 12:24; 13:44,49; 14:7
- B. This seemed to be their passion
 - We function best when we put the preaching and teaching of God's word first
 - 2) We are busy with other things!
- C. Wherever the early Christians went, they "preached the gospel there" Vs. 7
 - 1) What is the gospel? 13:27-32
 - 2) There are other truths that we must teach as these men did Matthew 28:18-20 - Acts 11:26
- I. They Preached the Gospel in Synagogues 1-2
 - A. The work of men sent Vs. 1
 - 1) "they went both together into the synagogue"
 - "a great multitude both of the Jews and also of the Greeks believed"
 - B. It created two kinds of people 1b & 2a
 - 1) Not Jews and Greeks!
 - 2) Believers and unbelievers
 - 3) This always happens
 - 4) It is happening now!
- II. They Preached the Gospel Fervently Vs. 3
 - A. They preached a long time
 - 1) "long time" = ikanon = "sufficient" + chronon
 - 2) They "abode" there = diatribo = "to wear through by rubbing", "to wear away", they made a place for themselves

- B. They preached boldly
 - 1) He (God) gave approval, "testimony"
 - 2) Signs and wonders were done
- III. Preaching the Gospel Caused Division Vs. 4
 - A. "But the multitude of the city was divided"
 - 1) Part held with the Jews
 - 2) Part held with the Disciples
 - 3) "divided" = schizo = "to split", "rend", "cleave as wood", "separate with violence" Not a typical modern day religious crusade.
 - B. Jesus had spoken of this
 - 1) Luke 12:51-53
 - 2) Matthew 10:34-36
- IV. Preaching the Gospel Brought Persecution Vs. 5
 - A. Unbelievers led an assault against them
 - 1) "assault" = horme = "any violent pressure", "an attack", "the first shock", "onset, as in war"
 - 2) "despitefully" = hubrizo = "to use wanton insult", "to act with insolence"
 - B. They fled their persecutors Vs. 6
 - 1) This was usually the case
 - 2) It is true in church history
- V. "And there they preached the gospel" Vs. 7
 - A. This is why they "fled"
 - 1) "fled" = katapheugo = "to flee down to any place", "to flee for refuge"
 - 2) They did not court death, they sought service to God!

- B. They preached the gospel there!
 - 1) They preached the gospel in Jerusalem!
 - 2) They preached it in the Temple!
 - 3) They preached it in Judea!
 - 4) They preached it in Samaria!
 - 5) They preached it in the Desert!
 - 6) They preached it in Azotus!
 - 7) They preached it in Caesarea!
 - 8) They preached it in Damascus!
 - 9) They preached it in Joppa!
- 10) They preached it in Phenice!
- 11) They preached it in Antioch!
- 12) They preached it in Cyprus!
- 13) They preached it in Saleucia!
- 14) They preached it in Paphos!
- 15) They preached it in Paphos!
- 16) They preached it in Perga!
- 17) They preached it in Antioch of Psidia!
- 18) They preached it in Iconium!

- 22) They preached the gospel "there"!

C. "There" is where we must preach!

- D. Why preach the gospel there?
 - 1) It is the place of God's provision
 - a. Elijah I Kings 17:4 "And it shall be, that thou shalt drink of the brook; and I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there."

This was at the brook Kedrith!

- 2) It is the place of God's command
 - a. Matthew 28:18-20
- 3) It is the place of God's power
