THE CHURCH'S FIRST INTERNAL CRISIS

Acts 6:1-7

Introduction:

- A. We have seen the Church's leadership endure persecution and pressure
 - 1) They were put "in hold" 4:3

2) They were "threatened" 4:17

3) They were put in the, "common prison" 5:18

- 4) They were "beaten" = dero = "to skin, flay, of animals; then slang, "to cudgel", "to thrash".
- B. This is the first recorded post-resurrection problem recorded in the Bible. (God solved the problem of Annias and Saphirra!
 - 1) This incident really occurred.
 - 2) It is written for our learning.
- vs. 1a I. The Crisis Was Created by Multiplying
 - A. "And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied."

- In contemporaneous time.
 "multiplied" = plethuno = "to make full", "to increase", "the number kept growing, at this time"
- B. The growth of almost anything will create the potential for problems.
 - 1) Solomon said so...Ecces. 6:11 "when goods increase, they are increased that eat them."
 - 2) Children, families, countries, schools, etc.
- Vs. 16 II. The Crisis was Caused by Murmuring
 - A. "there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministration."
 - "arose" = ginomai = "implying origin", "to come into being", "to become, or result", "to take place"
 "murmuring" = gogguzo = "to utter in a low voice privately", "probably
 - from the sound of air in a shell", "to manifest complaints"
 - 3) This may have been true, but it was an improper way to react because it offers no solution, only the worsening of a bad thing. (Based on some truth, erroneous interpretation and motive.)
 - B. God's people should never murmur.
 - Matt. 18:15-20 1) It is unscriptural!
 - It invariably grows and involves others.
 - 3) It is too dangerous! I Cor. 10:1-12
- III. The Crisis was Shared with the Multitude
 - A. "Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them."
 - 1) It was church business
 - 2) The entire church was informed

- B. The greater harm of the problem
 - 1) "It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables."
 - "reasonable" = harestos = "pleasing", pleasing to God, therefore it is not proper, fitting, in His sight.
 - 3) Read 5:29 This truth applies no matter who makes the request!
 - 4) Pastors ought to obey God rather than men out of the Church or men in the church.
- IV. The Solution was Suggested by the Apostles Vs. 3
 - A. The Church was to choose men.
 - 1) "look you out among you"
 - 2) "Pick out from among yourselves"
 - B. They were to chose qualified men
 - 1) Vs. 3
 - 2) We have no right to overlook and to excuse what God commands! I Tim.3:7
 - C. What did the Pastor's plan to do?
 - 1) Vs. 4
 - 2) People who attend church regularly rarely need visiting or counciling.
- V. The Proposal Pleased the Church and They Acted on it
 - A. "And the saying pleased the whole multitude"
 - 1) The church came into unity
 - 2) They then, could act on truth
 - B. "Whom they set before the Apostles"
 - 1) They co-operated in the effort
 - 2) Satisfaction and unity = co-operation
- VI. The Crisis was Solved. Three Great Benefits Accrued to God's Work Vs. 7
 - A. "And the word of God increased" 7a
 - 1) "increased" = auzano = "to receive increase", "to grow", "to grow up" "to grow"
 - 2) This is the only positive approach to doing God's work. Everything else always has built-in flaws that become instruments of total destruction. This is history's best lesson.
 - B. "and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly; 7a

 - "number" = harithmos = "a definite number"
 "multiplied" = plethono = "to make full; hence to multiply", "increase",
 - passive = "to be multiplied" They did not multiply themselves!
 "disciples" = mathetes = "a learner", "a pupil", one who follows both the teacher and the feaching.
 - 4) The increase or growth was "greatly", but this was not in Sunday School attendance. It was a growth in "learners and followers"

- C. "and a great company of the priests were obedient to the faith"

 - The word of God affected false religion
 "company" = ochlos = "crowd", "very many"
 "obedient" = upakouo "to hear" (with the idea of stealth, stillness, or attention in order to answer) "to listen and as a result to obey."
 This was, "to the faith", the whole thing.
