Individual Acts And Congregational Harmony

Colossians 3:12-14

Intro:

- A. The members of this congregation were to follow two courses of action.
 - 1. Vs. 8 They were to put-off the old man.
 - 2. Vs. 10 They were to put-on the new man.
- B. They could not make excuses.
 - 1. Vs. 11 Cultural backgrounds were not to be cited as reasons for bad behavior.
 - 2. Vs. 12 Christ was all for all.

I. They Were God's People Vs. 12

- A. "Put on therefore,..."
 - 1. "Put on" = $\epsilon \nu \delta \nu \omega \mu \alpha \iota$ = "to cloth one's self".
 - 2. "...clothe yourselves with..."
- B. "...as the elect of God, holy and beloved..."
 - 1. "Elect" = $\epsilon \kappa \lambda \epsilon \kappa \tau \sigma S$ = "to speak out", "to select".
 - 2. "Holy" = $\dot{\alpha}\gamma$ 101 = "separated from the common condition of the human race." "like God".
 - 3. "Beloved" = $\alpha \gamma \alpha \pi \alpha \omega$ = "to love", God had bestowed His love upon them. He had not removed it.

II. What They Were To Put On The New Man.

- A. "...bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;
 - 1. "Bowels of mercies" = $\sigma\pi\lambda\alpha\gamma\chi\nu\alpha$ = "the inward parts", "what one feels in one's gut", "tender pity", "compassionate mercy".
 - 2. "Kindness" = $\chi \rho \eta \sigma \tau \sigma \tau \eta \varsigma$ = "benevolence". A very sweet disposition in spite of opposition.
 - 3. "Humbleness of Mind" = $T\alpha\pi\epsilon\iota\nu o\phi\rho o\sigma\nu\nu\eta$ = "one whose thinking is low or modest, that is as he evaluates himself, opposite of high minded".
 - 4. "Meekness" = $\pi\rho\alpha\nu\tau\eta\varsigma$ = "enduring all things with an even temper", "Not punishing one's antagonizers though fully capable of doing so.
 - 5. "Longsuffering" = μακροθυμια = "long before

becoming angry", "not a person soon agitated".

III. They Were To Support One Another.

- A. Vs. 13 "Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any have a quarrel against any..."
 - 1. "Forbearing" = $\alpha\nu\in\chi\circ\mu\alpha\iota$ = "to hold up". This is a positive and does not have in it the idea of putting up with someone's sin or weakness. It means, to support.
 - 2. "Forgiving" = χαριζομαι = "to graciously be kind and to pardon one's wrong."
 - 3. "Quarrel" = $\mu o \mu \phi \eta$ = "fault found," "an occasion of blame or censure".
- B. "...even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."
 - 1. "Forgave" = (see #2 above).
 - 2. Just as the Lord has freely forgiven you, so must you also do" - Wms
 - 3. Matt. 6:14-15
 - 4. Matt. 11:24-26

IV. The Bonding Agent.

- A. Vs. 14 "And above all these things put on charity"
 - 1. "Above" = $\epsilon \pi \iota$ = "upon", "to put upon", "or as the final outer garment"
 - 2. "Charity" = $\alpha \gamma \alpha \pi \eta$ = "love".
 - 3. "And over all the rest put on the robe of love."
 - 4. "love covers the multitude of sins".
- B. "...which is the bond of perfectness."
 - 1. "Bond" = συνδεσμος = "that which binds together".
 - 2. "Perfectness" = $T \in \lambda \in IOT \cap S$ = "Completeness", "that which has reached it's full and intended end."
 - "...which binds everything together in perfect harmony" - RSV
