Intro:

- A. We know that Jesus personally established His church on this earth.
 - 1. The members had three qualifications.
 - 2. They were believers, they had John's baptism, and they responded to His call to forsake all and follow Him.
 - 3. Jesus was the Head and the instructor.
- B. After His sacrifice, His burial and His resurrection He sent His Apostles into the world to institute other congregations. They were a Church.
 - 1. They had His authority.
 - 2. They were to teach, baptize, and teach.
 - 3. The people who responded were to become churches and these churches would continue this work. They would, each of these congregations, become His body and He would be each churches head. They would have authority to teach, baptize, and teach. They would send out men.
- C. In Paul's letters we see how quickly and how well this worked.

 - 3. This was given in three ways. The Apostles, personal instruction, in congregation Prophets, and inspired letters. These inspired letters became the 27 books of the New Testament.
