The Three Attributes Of Harmony.

Colossians 3:15-17

Intro:

- A. The harmony of a New Testament Church is of utmost importance.
 - 1. It is the Body of Christ.
 - 2. It must reflect His character.
- B. Paul has written to this body and has emphasized this truth.
 - 1. Vs. 9 They are to <u>put off</u> the old man with his deeds.
 - 2. Vs. 12-14 They are to put on seven graces.
 - 3. Paul now writes of three things they must pursue or possess.

I. The Peace Of God Must Rule Them.

- A. "And let the peace of God rule in your hearts..."
 - 1. "Peace" = $\epsilon \iota \rho \eta \nu \eta$ = "Rest", "in contrast with strife", "a state of well-being", "undisturbed well-being".
 - 2. "Rule" = $B\rho\alpha\beta\epsilon\nu\omega$ = "to be an arbiter in the public games;" "to be the decider".
 - 3. "Let the peace that Christ gives be the factor that makes your decisions..."
- B. "to the which also ye are called in one body..."
 - 1. "Called" = $K\alpha\lambda\epsilon\omega$ = "to summon".
 - 2. "that is why you have been called as members of one body."
 - 3. God never calls anyone to disturb or prevent peace from existing and reigning in a church.
- C. "...and be ye thankful."
 - 1. "Thankful" = $\varepsilon v \chi \rho \iota \sigma \tau \sigma S$ = This is a thankfulness based upon knowing what God has done for them.
 - 2. "And practice being grateful..."

II. The Truth Of Christ Must Dwell.

- A. Vs. 16 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom..."
 - 1. "Word" = $\lambda 0 \gamma 0 S$ = "the teachings of Christ".
 - 2. " \overline{Dwell} " = $\epsilon \nu o \iota \kappa \epsilon \omega$ = "to inhabit", "to make its

home in".

- 3. "Richly" = $\pi \lambda o \nu \sigma \iota \omega \varsigma =$ "abundantly".
- 4. Let Christ's teachings reside in you abundantly as true wisdom..."
- B. "teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs..."
 - 1. "Teaching" = $\delta \iota \delta \alpha \sigma \kappa \omega$ = "to give instruction".
 - 2. "Admonishing" = $\nu o \nu \theta \in T \in \omega$ = "to put in mind", "to correct one who is at fault".
 - 3. "Psalms" = $\psi\alpha\lambda\mu$ os = The psalms of the O.T. sung to (with) musical accompaniment.
 - 4. "Hymns" = $\dot{\nu}\mu\nu$ OS = A song that is a praise to God. A festive song of praise. Originally it referred only to music.
 - 5. "Songs" = $\omega \delta \eta$ = Any kind of a song.
 - 6. "Spiritual" = Πνευματική = Songs that relate only to spiritual things. The only way to be positive is to judge them by the Spirit's book, the Bible.
- C. "...singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."
 - 1. "Singing" = $\alpha\delta\omega$ = "to sing", "to chant", "to sing in honour", "celebrate in song".
 - 2. "Singing to the Lord with thankful hearts." Tay
 - 3. We do not sing for others but as we sing to the Lord, others should be instructed.

III. They Must Have The Right Motive.

- A. Vs. 17 "And whatever you do in word or deed,"
 - 1. "Word" = $\lambda \circ \gamma \circ \varsigma$ = "the spoken word".
 - 2. "Deed" = $\epsilon \rho \gamma \rho \nu$ = "labour", "act", "action".
 - 3. "And everything whatever you do in word or in work..." (of the things above).
- B. "...do all in the nave of the Lord Jesus..."
 - 1. "all things do in the nave of the Lord Jesus..."
 - 2. "...with reference to the Lord Jesus."
 - 3. "...as a representative..." Wms
- C. "...giving thanks to God and the Father by him."
 - 1. "...and through Him continue to give thanks to God the Father." Wms
 - 2. Give God thanks because He enables us to work and to talk.
