THE REDEMPTIVE WORK OF CHRIST EPH. 1:7-10

Introduction:

- A. We know that we have innumerable blessings.
 - 1. God's declaration of His work for us.
 - a. Psalm 40:5 "many, 0 lord my god, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done, and thy thoughts which are to usward...they are more than can be numbered."
- B. God's blessings flow through Jesus Christ.
 - 1. 1:3.
 - 2. He is God's channel of blessing manward.
 - 3. In Him is our desire!
- C. Redemption is a work of Christ.
 - It is God's way of saving in Christ all that Adam lost in the fall.
 - 2. Redemption is "in him."
- I. CHRIST HAS REDEEMED OUR SOULS. V7
 - A. "In whom we have redemption."
 - redemption = apolutrosis = releasing on receipt of ransom.
 - We were held in bondage, unable to affect our own release.

Sons of God; born again, translation, redemption, atonement, justification.

- B. "through his blood."
 - The equal gift of the price of redemption was not.
 Jesus, but His blood.
 - 2. Heb. 9:12 "Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us."

- 3. I Peter 1:18-21.
- 4. Christ's blood was Satan's demand.
- C. "the forgiveness of sins."
 - forgiveness = aphesis = discharge, setting free.
 - Because of His blood paying the ransom we can walk away from our sins, we are discharged from their consequence.
- D. "according to the riches of his grace."
 - 1. rich = plousis = abounding in riches.
 - All of this can be accomplished because of His super-abounding grace.
- I. CHRIST HAS REVEALED HIS WORK. V8-9
 - A. "wherein he hath abounded toward us."
 - abounded = perisseuo = to be over and above, more than enough.
 - 2. God gave us more than enough.
 - B. "in all wisdom and prudence."
 - wisdom = phronasis = the fruit of sophia = cleverness, skill, a right application of knowledge, practical wisdom.
 - prudence = good sense in the management of affairs, intention, purpose.
 - C. "Having made known unto us the mystery of his will."
 - 1. made known = qnorisas = to make known.
 - 2. mystery = musterion = an unrevealed fact.
 - 3. His will has been a progressive revelation.
 - 4. His will about what?
 - D. "according to his good pleasure which he hath purposed in himself."
 - good pleasure = eudokia = a being well pleased, free and willing purpose with a good design.

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- 2. purposed = prothesis = pro-thesis = a setting forth or before, what one sets before his mind.
- 3. in himself = God set His plans before Himself for His approval, not man's!

III. THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF REDEMPTION. VIO

- A. "That in the dispensation of the fullness of time."
 - dispensation = oikonomia = administration of a household, the administrative activity of the owner or steward.
 - The way the owner of a house would arrange all the furniture and control the ultimate outcome of a house, so God follows a plan for his universe.
 - fullness of time = pleroma = that with which anything is filled or of which it is full, the contents.
 - 4. When God's measuring device is filled with time, then it is time to act, as an hour glass is filled with sand.
- B. "he might gather together in one all things in Christ."
 - 1. "anakephalaiosasthai to gather again under one head, to sum up, to gather up into one. (For this word, s. Barth; Robinson; Abbot.) The prep. in compound refers to the prior dispersion of the elements and the substitutive of the verb sescribes the ultimate aggregation in one; thus the whole compound involves the idea of "unity" effected out of diversity, (lightfoot notes) The inf. is used to explain the preceding."
 - all things = things in heaven and in earth.
- C. "both which are in heaven (the heavens) and which are on the earth."
 - God plans to unify that which is fragmented.
 - Nothing is right that is separated from God's control and the lordship of Jesus.

- A. "who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?"
 - 1. worthy = axios = worth, equal value, or like worth.
 - 2. Who can fill the role of redeemer?
- B. The answer. v3
 - 1. "No man."
 - 2. "and I wept much."
- C. Who is worthy?
 - 1. v5.
 - 2. 09.
 - 3. v12.
- D. I Tim. 6:13-16.
 - v16, "Which in his times he shall shew, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords."
 - Rev. 11:15 "The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our lord, and of His Christ: and he shall reign forever and ever."

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
