WALKING AS CHILDREN OF LIGHT EPH. 5:17-21

Introduction:

- A. The Christian is left in the world after his birth into God's family and Kingdom.
 - Jesus emphasized this in His prayer.
 - 2. We are to live a life that honors God.
- B. Our life as a Christian is likened as a walk.
 - 1. walk in love.
 - 2. walk as children of light.

How can we walk in love, light, and follow God?

- C. Light is symbolic of enlightenment.
 - 1. It may mean God's Will.
 - It means what God has revealed.
 - 3. There is no "inner light," it is "outer light."

I. KNOW THE WILL OF GOD. V17

- A. "wherefore be ye not unwise."
 - 1. Because time is of the essence.
 - unwise = aphron = without understanding.
- B. "but understanding what the will of the Lord is."
 - understanding = suniemi the ability to bring things together and see them in relationship to one another. The saints are to use their reasoning powers.
 - 2. will = thelema wish, desire, active volition.

II. BE FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT OF GOD. V18

- A. "and be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess."
 - drunk = methuskomai to get drunk, the inability to presserve one's self control, committing distasteful acts.

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- excess = asotia one who cannot save our spare, and extravagantly squanders his means and is debauched.
- Don't get your stimulus from wine for there is always the danger of excessive drinking.
- "but be filled with the Spirit." в.
 - filled = pleroo to fill. (control)
 - "but let the Spirit stimulate your life." 2.
 - The bacchus festivals were drunken orgies. 3.

The religious celebrations of Dionysus were well-known to the ancient world. The worshipers felt that they were united, indwelled, and controlled by Dionysus who gave them special powers and abilities (s. the references by the previous word; s. also H.J.Rose, Religion in Greece and Rome, 60f. III. ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER. V19

- *speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs."
 - speaking = laleo [having a dialogue] to use the human voice with words, to talk, and with another to hold colloquy. conversation.
 - psalms = psalmos song of praise, psalm, The verb 2. meant primarily the plucking of strings and the noun was used of sacred songs chanted to the accompaniment of instrumental music.
 - 3. hymns = humnos sacred poetical compositions whose primary purpose is to praise.
 - songs spiritual = ode pneumatikais any king of 4. song, especially lyric poety, but "spiritual."
 - Amy Grant. The moan that keeps the family together. ь.
 - "singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord." в.
 - singing = adontes singing.

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- making melody = psallo to chant accompanied by stringed instruments.
- singing and psalming with the heart of you to the Lord. With all of your heart.

- A. "giving thanks always for all things."
 - 1. always.
 - 2. all things.
- B. "unto God and the Father."
 - 1. God theo.
 - 2. Father patri.
- C. "in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."
 - 1. name onomasi name.
 - 2. Lord Jesus Christ.

V. DO NOT INSIST ON YOUR OWN WAY. V21

- A. "submitting yourselves one to another."
 - 1. submit = hupotassomai to line one's self up under, to submit. Used in a military sines of soldiers submitting to their superior or slaves submitting to their masters. The word has primarily the idea of giving up one's own right or will, i.e., "to subordinate one's self"
 - a. allelois dat. pl. "to one another."
- B. "in the fear of God."
 - fear phobos fear.
 - God = christou Christ.
- VI. THESE CONCEPTS ARE NOT THE WAY OF SALVATION, BUT THE WAY AFTER SALVATION.
 - A. We do not "walk" the right path to salvation.
 - B. We walk the right path after salvation.
