Being Hindered From Running Well

Galatians 5:7-10

Intro:

- A. Paul often uses athletics and athletic events to illustrate spiritual truths.
 - 1. He does not use them personally to draw crowds or manipulate the curious.
 - 2. He writes of wrestlers, fighters, Runners.
- B. Why does Paul do this?
 - 1. They are decidely carnal activities!
 - 2. Because of their universality, the olympics.
 - 3. Because they speak of discipline.
 - 4. Because they speak of effort.

I. The Galatians As Runners.

- A. Vs. 7 "ye did run well;"
 - 1. "Run" = $\tau \rho \epsilon \chi \omega$ = "to run, to run a race".
 - 2. "Well" = $\kappa \alpha \lambda \omega s$ = well.
 - 3. "You were progressing nicely..."
 - 4. They were maturing and growing spiritually.
- B. "...who did <u>hinder</u> you that you should not <u>obey</u> the truth"?
 - 1. "Hinder" = $\epsilon \gamma \kappa \sigma \pi \tau \omega$ = "to cut in", "to thwart", "an olympic expression, and properly signifies coming across the course while a person is running in it and thereby jostling the person who is running and throwing him off course"
 - 2. "Obey" = $\pi \epsilon \iota \theta \omega$ = "to persuade", "win by words".
 - 3. "Truth" = $\alpha\lambda\eta\theta\epsilon\iota\alpha$ = "the manifested, veritable essence of a matter"; "reality".
 - 4. "Who threw you off course so that you did not continue to be persuaded by the truth"?
 - 5. They ran well, they messed up!

II. God Didn't Do It.

- A. Vs.8 "This <u>persuasion</u> cometh not of him that <u>calleth</u> you."
 - 1. "Persuasion" = $\pi \epsilon \iota \sigma \mu o \nu \eta$ = "being easily persuaded".
 - 2. "Calleth" = $\kappa \alpha \lambda \epsilon \omega$ = "to call anyone".
 - 3. "This error you embraced did not come from the one who called you" (to salvation, God)

- B. Men should accept responsibility for their beliefs and actions.
 - 1. Many blame others for their stumbling.
 - 2. The <u>Pastor</u>, the <u>deacons</u>, <u>parents</u>, the <u>heat</u>, the <u>cold</u>, the <u>music</u>, the <u>musicians</u>, the <u>time</u>, the <u>circumstances</u>, the <u>weather</u>, their <u>health</u>, the whatever... God does not tempt us with error, He does not send the apostles of Satan, Satan sends them.

III. The Consequence Of Their Error.

- A. Vs. 9 "A little leaven leaventh the whole lump."
 - 1. "Little" = $\mu \iota \kappa \rho \circ \varsigma = "small"$.
 - 2. "Leaven" = $\zeta \nu \mu \eta$ = "leaven", "yeast".
 - 3. "Lump" = $\phi \nu \rho \alpha \mu \alpha$ = "that which is mixed, a lump or batch of dough".
 - 4. This means that the false doctrine of circumcision will affect and infect the entire church.
- B. Paul used this same illustration of the one person practicing immorality in the Corinthian church.
 - 1. I Cor. 5:1-13
 - 2. He expands it to other sins.
 - 3. This is based on the Passover.
 - 4. Deut 16:1-3

IV. The Person Who Led Them Astray.

- A. Vs. 10 "I have confidence in you through the Lord..."
 - 1. "Confidence" = $\pi \epsilon \iota \theta \omega$ = "to persuade", "win by words", "influence".
 - 2. "Through" = $\epsilon \nu$ = "in"
 - "I trust fully in the Lord..."
- B. "...that ye will be none otherwise minded:"
 - 1. "None" = $0\nu\delta\epsilon\iota\varsigma$ = "Not one".
 - 2. "Otherwise" = $\alpha\lambda\lambda \circ S$ = "not the same".
 - 3. "Minded" = $\phi \rho o \nu \epsilon \omega$ = "to have intellect, to be minded, regard, care for".
 - 4. "You will not accept this contrary view."
- C. "but he that <u>troubleth</u> you shall bear his <u>judgment</u>, whoever he be."
 - 1. "Troubleth" = $\tau \alpha \rho \alpha \sigma \sigma \omega$ = "to stir up, to agitate, as water in a pool"; of the mind, "to stir up", "to disturb with various emotions"...
 - 2. "Bear" = βασταζω = "to carry", "to assume".

"Judgment" = κριμα = "the decision arrived at, the sentence pronounced." This is not a decision to be made. The consequences of heresy are already decided. This preacher was already judged.
Paul does not give him a name. He does name Peter

4. Paul does not give him a name. He does name Peter earlier. He does use the name of James as a person who will condemn Peter and others who do not keep

themselves Jewish.

- D. God will judge_us.
 - 1. I Cor. 4:5
 - 2. II Cor. 4:10
 - 3. "He that believeth not is condemned already."
