Paul's Labor Among The Galatians

Galatians 4:12-16

Intro:

- A. Paul has expressed a fear of the Churches.
 - 1. **Vs. 4** His thoughts of them caused troubled feelings.
 - 2. He believed his arduous labor might come to naught.
- B. What caused him to have this fear?
 - 1. The showed signs of going back to sin's bondage.
 - 2. This was seen in the observation of so-called, "special days".
- I. Paul Was Not Bound By His Former Religion. Vs. 12
 - A. Vs. 12 "Brethren, I beseech you, be as I am..."
 - 1. "Beseech" = $\delta \epsilon$ ομαι = "to beg", "to supplicate".
 - 2. "I beg you, brothers, in this matter, be like me..."
 - B. "...for I am as ye are:"
 - 1. "I was once where you are..."
 - 2. I know how you feel
 - C. "...ye have not injured me at all."
 - 1. "Injured" = $\alpha\delta\iota\kappa\epsilon\omega$ = "to someone wrong", "to act unjustly", "to harm or hurt".
 - 2. "You have never taken advantage of me".
 - 3. Paul was not retaliating against them for some past insult or injury.
- II. Paul's First Contact With Them. Vs. 13-14
 - A. "Ye know how through <u>infirmity</u> of the flesh I preached the gospel unto you first."
 - 1. "<u>Infirmity</u>" = αστενεια = "feebleness, sickness".
 - 2. "You know how handicapped I was by illness when I first preached the gospel to you" Phi
 - 3. Paul didn't wait for the "right time", He did what he should do in spite of embarrassment and pain.
 - B. Vs. 14 "And my temptation which was in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected;"
 - 1. "Temptation" = $\pi \in \Omega \cap \Omega \cap \Omega \cap \Omega \cap \Omega$ = "a putting to the test".
 - 2. "Despised" = εξουθενεω = "to treat as contemptible".
 - 3. "Rejected" = ξκπτνω = "to spit, spit out".
 - 4. "You didn't shrink from me or let yourselves be

revolted at the disease which was such a trial to you." - Phi

- C. "...but received me as an angel of God, even as Christ Jesus."
 - Paul was God's messenger.
 - 2. Paul was the representative of Jesus.
- D. What was Paul's illness?
 - 1. II Cor. 12:7-10.
 - 2. Whatever his illness, Paul preached and gave service to God. His grace is seen in weakness.

III. The Changed Attitude Of The Galatians.

- A. Vs. 15 "Where is then the blessedness ye spoke of?"
 - 1. "<u>Blessedness</u>" = μακαρισμος = "happiness".
 - 2. "Where is that joyous confidence of our early relationship"?
 - 3. Paul was still God's messenger. He still represented Jesus Christ.
- B. "for I bear you <u>record</u>, that, if it had been possible, ye would have <u>plucked</u> out your own eyes, and have given them to me".
 - 1. "for I bear you witness..."
 - 2. "Plucked" = ϵ ξορυσσω = "to dig out, tear out".
 - 3. What greater act of love than to blind one's self and give their sight to another?
 - 4. This may give some insight into Paul's, "thorn in the flesh".

IV. Paul's Unanswerable Question.

- A. "Am I therefore become your <u>enemy</u>, because I tell you the truth?"

 - 2. "Am I now against you, an adversary, because I speak to you the truth"?
- B. The Bible tells us the truth. It is our true and faithful friend.
 - 1. <u>Prov 27:5,6</u> "Open rebuke is better than secret love." "Faithful are the wounds of a friend; but the kisses of an enemy are deceitful."
 - 2. <u>Prov. 17:17</u> "A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity."
- C. Love tells the truth.
 - 1. You cannot love someone too much to tell them the truth.

2. Not telling truth is a sign of selfishness and spiritual and moral weakness.
