## Galatians 1:18-24

## Intro:

- A. Paul writes of his past life.
  - 1. Vs. 13 He persecuted the church. (to hunt)
  - 2. Vs. 13 He wasted the church.
  - 3. **Vs. 14** He was exceedingly zealous.
  - 4. He was singularly successful in the Jew's religion.
- B. Paul was saved by God's grace.
  - 1. Vs. 16 He revealed Jesus to Paul.
  - 2. He revealed Jesus in Paul.
  - 3. **Vs. 17** Jesus met Paul in Arabia and gave him a revelation of Jesus as Lord and the mystery hidden from the ages, Jew and Gentile in the church.
- C. God's purpose in Paul.
  - 1. That Paul would preach and teach.
  - 2. That he would become an Apostle to the Gentiles.
  - 3. For God to be glorified in Paul, not for God to glorify Paul.
- I. Paul Does Go To Jerusalem. Vs. 18-19
  - A. Vs. 18 He went to see Peter.
    - 1. He left from Damascus. Acts 9:23-25
    - 2. He abode with Peter.
    - 3. He went for fellowship and mutual edification.
  - B. Vs. 19 He did not see other Apostles.
    - They were scattered and preaching.
    - 2. James was an influential believer.
    - 3. He believed after the Resurrection. John 7:5
- II. Paul Asserts His Honesty. Vs. 20
  - A. "Now the things which I write unto you, behold, before God, I lie not."
    - 1. "Lie" = ψευδομαι = "to tell a lie".
    - 2. "And I declare before God I'm writing no lie."
      Beck
  - B. Vs. 12 Paul is referring to his first claim.
    - 1. He did not receive the gospel from man.
    - 2. No man taught it to him.
    - 3. It was by revelation.
- III. Paul Continues His Work.

- He turns back East. Vs. 21 A.
  - Syria
  - Cilicia 2.
- He is not known by sight.

  1. He is unknown by face.
  - "Unknown" =  $\alpha \gamma \nu o \epsilon \omega$  = "to be ignorant".
- C.
- He is known by reputation.

  1. Vs. 23 The persecutor of times past.

  2. He now preaches what he once destroyed.
- Vs. 24 They glorified God in Paul.
  1. Paul was converted.
  2. Paul was a disciple, a learner.
  3. Paul was committed, a slave.
  4. He was an ambassador.
  5. He was a soldier.
  6. All of these speak of obedience. D.
