AN EVIL HEART OF UNBELIEF Hebrews 3:12-16

INTRODUCTION:

- A. The nation of Israel refused to believe God
 - 1) They would not hear His word
 - 2) They hardened their hearts
 - 3) They tried God by asking for proof of God's love and power to provide for them.
 - 4) They provoked God by their unbelief
 - 5) They always misjudged God and did not know His paths
- B. God would not let them enter into the land of Canaan
 - They refused to believe Joshua and Caleb
 - 2) God swore that they would not enter in to it
 - 3) 3:11
 - 4) This "rest" was inhabiting the land of promise Numbers 14:23, 30, 35 Deut.
 - 5) This "rest" was literally a permanent abode in this land, where they could give all of their time and energy to serving the Lord.
 - 6) Deut. 12:1-12
 - C. What is a good illustration of God's will for the Israelites?
 - God wants us to give Him our service
 - 2) Suppose He made us all extremely wealthy in order to face us all from worry.
 - 3) Would we have services every day?
 - 4) What would we do with our wealth?
 - D. God was warning this congregation
 - 1) They were loaning toward unbelief
 - 2) They were close to hardening their hearts

- I. This Hebrew Congregation Should Think About Their Circumstances verse 12
 - A. "Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief"
 - 1) "take heed" = $\beta\lambda\epsilon\pi\epsilon\tau\epsilon$ = "to see to it". This warning should be taken seriously.
 - 2) "evil" = πονηρος = "active malignancy"
 - 3) "unbelief" = απιστιας = "faithlessness", "untrustiness",
 "distrust"
 - B. "in departing from the living God"
 - 1) "departing" = αφιστημι = "to place away from",
 "remove", "to cause to depart"
 - 2) "And desert the cause of the living God"
- II. The Action They Should Take verse 13
 - A. "But exhort one another daily, while it is called today"
 - 1) "exhort" = παρακαλεω = "to encourage"
 - 2) "one another" = εαυτους = "yourselves"
 - 3) "Encourage yourselves every day, day by day, while there is still a today"
 - B. "lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin"
 - 1) "hardened" = σκληρυνω = "to make day, stiff"
 - 2) "deceitfulness" = $\alpha\pi\alpha\tau\eta$ = "deceit, esp. by false statements", "self-deception"
 - 3) "Through the deceitful character of sin"
 - 4) Sin never tells the truth about itself
 - 5) Satan is a liar and the father of it

- III. What The Steadfast Congregation Possesses
 - A. "For we are made partakers of Christ..." vs 14a
 - 1) "partakers" = $\mu \epsilon \tau o \chi o \varsigma$ = "having an association with another", "a sharer with another"
 - 2) "For we all participate in Christ"
 - B. How are we "sharers" in Christ?
 - 1) Romans 12:4-5
 - 2) Ephesians 5:30 "For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones."
 - 3) The church is the body of Christ and if the body (church) is dissolved through neglect they will lose this association, partaking.
- IV. We May Lose, As A Congregation, This Sharing verse 14b
 A. "...if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast unto the end."
 - 1) "hold" = $\kappa \alpha \tau \epsilon \chi \omega$ = "to hold down", "hold fast"
 - 2) "beginning" = $\alpha p \chi \eta$ = "origin"
 - 3) "confidence" = υποσασις = "that which underlies",
 "ground", "basis"
 - 4) "steadfast" = $\kappa \alpha \tau \epsilon \chi \omega$ = "to hold down"
 - 5) "If we really keep the conviction that we had at first, unshaken to the very end" Gspd
 - B. They were beginning to doubt the validity of their initial commitment to Christ and to one another.
 - 1) They had an "origin" as a church
 - 2) This was a present tense relationship

- V. They Should Remember Two Historical Facts verses 15-16
 - A. "while it is said, "Today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts, as in the day of provocation." vs 15
 - 1) "Remember what is written"
 - 2) Hear His voice, open your heart, and do not do what our fathers did.
 - 3) Don't repeat the mistakes of the past
 - B. "For some, when they had heard, did provoke:" vs 16
 - 1) "For who, when they heard did provoke?"
 - 2) "Who were they that heard and yet were rebellious?" RSV
 - C. "...howbeit not all that came out of Egypt by Moses"
 - 1) "Had they all not gotten out of Egypt under Moses?" Ber
 - 2) "...who had escaped from Egypt under Moses' leadership" Gspd
 - 3) We understand that some 600,000 people came out of Egypt.
 We know of only (2) that specifically did not rebel
 against God's plan and purpose for Israel.
 - 4) The rebellion was by the majority
 - D. This is a lesson in type
 - As a nation they were delivered
 - 2) As a nation they were baptized
 - 3) As a nation they were led by the Pillar and Cloud
 - 4) As a nation they rebelled
