THE FIRST COVENANT

Hebrews 9:1-6

INTRODUCTION:

- A. We have studied the New Covenant
 - 1) God has made two
 - 2) The old has vanished away
- B. In order to contrast the two, Paul gives the basic outline of the first covenant.
 - 1) He describes the tabernacle
 - 2) He describes and gives meaning to the services of the tabernacle.
- C. Why doesn't Paul use the temple?
 - 1) The temple was David's idea
 - 2) He felt that God deserved more than a portable tent for His dwelling.
 - 3) There were changes made in the configuration of the holy of holies. It was a cube and not a rectangle.
 - 4) There were (10) lampstands and there were (10) tables for shewbread.
- I. The Tabernacle, God's Plan
 - A. "Then verily the first covenant had also ordinances of divine service, and a worldly sanctuary." vs 1
 - "ordinances" = δικαιωμα = "the product or result of justifying", "legal statutes, ordinances"
 - 2) "divine service" = λατρεια = "obedience and adoration rendered to God", "to render service to God", "worship"
 - 3) "worldly" = κοσνικός = "what belongs to this present order of things"
 - 4) "sanctuary" = $\alpha \gamma io \gamma$ = "that which is sacred"
 - 5) Exodus 25:8-9

- B. The holy place vs 2
 - 1) There was a tabernacle
 - 2) There were two "rooms"
 - 3) The first two-thirds
 - 4) The furnishings. They are not said to be typical, yet they did illustrate what pleases God.
 - 5) The offerings are typical, as was the tabernacle itself
- C. The holy of holies vs 3-5
 - 1) The veil vs 3
 - 2) The veil was rent in the temple Matthew 27:50-51
- D. The golden censer vs 4a
 - 1) These were firepans to offer incense
 - 2) Leviticus 16:12-13
- E. The ark of the covenant vs 4b
 - 1) The golden pot, filled with manna
 - 2) Aaron's rod that budded
 - 3) The tables of the covenant (Ten Commandments)
- F. The cherubims of glory vs 5
 - 1) They "shadowed the mercy seat"
 - 2) Exodus 25:17-22
 - 3) "particularly" = καταμερος = "in detail"
- G. The holy place was the place of day-to-day service vs 6
 - 1) This is not typical of Christ's work
 - 2) The offerings typified Christ but not in His work as a High Priest.
