## THE SIN OF UNBELIEF Hebrews 3:17-19

## INTRODUCTION:

- A. This Hebrew congregation was in danger of apostasy
  - 1) They were loosening their original commitments to Christ
  - 2) They were, "forsaking the assembling of themselves together"
- B. They are warned not to become unbelievers
  - 1) verse 12
  - 2) verses 18-19
- I. Those Who Sinned verse 17
  - A. "But with whom was he grieved forty years?"
    - 1) "grieved" = προσοχθιζω = "to be burdened or heavy laden with", "to be sore vexed with"
    - 2) "And with whom was God wearied..."
  - B. "...was it not with them that had sinned, whose carcasses fell in the wilderness?"
    - 1) "Was it not with them who sinned..."
    - 2) "Whose bodies lay where they fell in the wilderness?"
  - C. The record of their sin
    - 1) Numbers 25:1 "committed whoredoms"
    - 2) Numbers 21:4-6 "fiery serpents"
  - D. The interpretation of their sin
    - 1) I Corinthians 10:6 "ensamples"
    - 2) I Corinthians 10:11 "ensamples

- II. The Basis Of Their Sin verse 18
  - A. "And to whom sware he that they should not enter into his rest, but to them that believed not?" vs 18
    - 1) "enter" = εισερχομαι = "to come or go into"
    - 2) "rest" = καταπαυσις = "a place of rest", "a resting down",
       "putting to rest", "fixed abode"
    - 3) "believed Not" =  $\alpha\pi\epsilon\iota\theta\epsilon\omega$  = "to be disobedient", "unbelief passed into action"
    - 4) "And who was it to whom God made oath" Gspd. "that they should not be admitted to His place of rest, save unto them who were faithless and disbelieving"
  - B. "So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief"
    - 1) "unbelief" =  $\alpha\pi$ ιστια = "no faith"
    - 2) "We see, then that they failed to enter upon it because of want of faith"
  - III. Some Facts To Consider
    - A. They were sinners
      - 1) This was not the basis of failure
      - 2) Success is not built on sinlessness!
    - B. They would not believe!
      - 1) ! His word to them
      - 2) His power to do what He said
      - 3) Their unbelief led to their sin and rebellion
