## CONCERNING SPIRITUAL GIFTS I COR. 12:1-3

## Introduction:

- A. We must interpret the Bible, by the Bible.
  - 1. Some study to prove prior beliefs.
  - 2. Some study to disprove prior beliefs.
- B. The proper way to , "rightly divide the word of truth" is to accept the concept of dispensations or ages.
  II Tim. 2:15.
  - Dispensationalism is the truth that God has chosen to deal with mankind differently in different ages.
    - a. Not in the plan of salvation.
    - b. Has always been by faith.
  - Some examples of dispensationalism.
    - a. Adam and Eve in the garden.
    - b. Noah building an Ark, the rainbow.
    - c. Israel as God's Kingdom witnesses.

Matt. 11:43 "Therefore, say I unto you, The Kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof."

- d. This was not an abrogation of the Abrahamic Covenant, but a fulfilling of the Mosaic Covenant.
- e. The church is not the Kingdom witnesses.
- C. The church age or the "last days" were to be marked by signs.
  - 1. Acts 2:1-24.
  - The day of Pentecost was fulfilling of prophecy.
     Joel 2:28-32 (822).
  - Jesus had been approved by miracles. Acts 2:22.
  - 4. The statement of Jesus. Mark 16:14-20.
- D. The "last days" are the "last days of man's world," not the very last days of the earth.

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- 1. The "last days" have been on-going for 1900 years.
- v17,18 are signs of the beginning of the "last days"
   a. Revelation; Viais, Trumpets, Woes.
- 3. v19-20 are signs of the end of the last days.
- 4. v21, is the truth for all of the "last days" or every day of those last days.
- 5. signs, Ken Copeland.
- E. The questions we must answer.
  - 1. How long were these special gifts to continue?
    - a. To the coming of Christ?
    - b. To the giving of Scripture?
- I. TRUTHS NECESSARY TO COMPREHEND GIFTS.
  - A. People who over-emphasized gifts were ignorant.
    - 1. vi.
    - ignorant = agnoeo want of perception.
  - B. The two absolute requisites for a belief in tongues and healing.
    - 1. Ignorance (of Bible).
    - 2. Immaturity (spiritually).
  - C. The Gentiles were the primary abusers. v2
    - 1. Why?
      - a. They were accustomed to being "led" by emotion.
- b. The Jews used written revelation; Amp. "You know that when you were heathen, you were led off after idols that could not speak, habitually, as impulse directed you and whenever the occasion might arise."
  - 2: carry away = apago to lead away, to conduct.
  - 3. As worshipers of idols they were caught up in estatic utterances and so-called visitations.
  - The Hindus, Moselms, Buddhists, etc. practice estatic utterances.

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- D. The work of the Holy Spirit.
  - 1. "wherefore I give you to understand."
  - understand = gnorizo to make known, reveal.
  - 3. The negative statement.
    - a. No man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed."

(1) accursed = anathema - something consecrated to God; among Jews what was consecrated could not be redeemed, if living must be put to death. In the N.T. sense, to say the Jesus was "anathema" meant he was a malefactor, one justly condemned to death.

- (2) The Holy Spirit would never lead anyone to call Jesus "anathema."
- 4. The positive statement.
  - a. "and that no man can say Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Spirit."
- (1) Men affirmed themselves to be a Christian by affirming their faith in the historic Jesus as "the Lord."
  - (2) Not revealed by flesh and blood.
  - (3) Matt. 16:13-17.
  - (4) I John 4:1-3.
  - E. This doesn't mean you can't say the words.
    - i. It means you can't make the commitment.
  - II. THE SPIRIT OF GOD HAS NOT CEASED HIS WORKING.
    - A. He leads us to His Word.
    - B. He is our Comforter.
      - 1. He aids us in our suffering.
    - C. He convicts men of the truth about Himself.
      - 1. This is the most important work.
