- A. These statements will be clearer to us for two reasons.
 - 1. The current interest in running.
 - 2. 1984 Olympic games in Los Angeles.
 - 3. Ithmian games, every 3 years at Corinth.
- B. This does not present the plan of salvation.
 - 1. God puts you on the track.
 - 2. You out run the devil.
- C. This is an exhortation to effort and excellence.
 - 1. The winner entered the race, and won.
 - 2. Everyone should strive as the winner did.
- I. ALL ARE RUNNERS IN THE RACE. V24
 - A.We are all entered in the race.
 - 1. Not a matter of individual choice.
 - Here we can stay at home, not so in the Christian race.
 - a. "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all."
 - B. The prize is to the winner.
 - 1. "but one receiveth the prize."
 - prize = a wreath, chaplet, or garland.
 - C. If you don't run, you can't win.
 - 1. "so run, that ye may win."
 - 2. If a person never enters the Boston Marathon, that person will never win it!
- II. THOSE WHO WIN ARE THOUGH. V25a

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- A. "and every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things."
 - striveth = agonizomai to be a competitor in a contest, hence to try, to train.
 - Those who seek to win make an effort.
- B. "is temperate in all things."
 - 1.He is temperate in his habits.
 - 2.He trains. Heb. 12:1.

III. THE PRIZE. V255

- A. "now they to obtain a corruptible crown."
 - corruptible = phthartos perishable.
 - 2. This was a wreath of leaves.
- B. "but we an incorruptible."
 - 1. Never will perish.

IV. PAUL'S PROGRAM. V26

- A. He ran certainly "not as uncertainly"
 - 1. certainly = with resolution.
 - He had a purpose and an aim.
- B. He fought purposefully, v26b.
 - 1. "so fight I, not as one that beateth the air."
 - a. fight = mukteuo to fight as a boxer.
 - b. beateth = jdero to energetically beat.
 - c. air = haer the air.

V. PAUL IDENTIFIED HIS GREATEST HINDRANCE. V27

- A. Pauls body was the source of defeat.
 - "But I keep under my body and bring it into subjection."
 - a. subjection = doulagogeo to lead as a slave, to make a slave of.
 - b. "I control my flesh, it does not control me."

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- B. He had to become his bodys master.
 - 1. This is fighting the will of the flesh.
 - 2. Not a once-and-for all victory!

VI. PAUL'S GREATEST FEAR.

- A. "lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."
 - preached = Keruksas a hearld, one who announced at the games, calling the contestants to the line, and giving out the rules. (Thisis a possibility.)
 - castaway = adokimos that which will not stand the test or proof, generally used to speaks of metals.
 - a. The inspection of metal castings and finding one that is flawed.
- B. After Paul had preached to others he did not want to become a victim of his own flesh and be flawed and useless.
