WITNESSES TO THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS I COR. 15:5-11

Introduction:

- A. Men seek for proof.
 - 1. Prove it! A cry heard often.
 - 2. Usually people who demand proof won't accept it.
- B. In the field of criminal law, an eye witness is of inestimable value.
 - 1. In the Bible, 2 or 3 witnesses establishes quilt
 - 2. Our courts are satisfied with 2 or 3 witnesses.
- C. Many Christian doctrines are not open to the "eyewitness demand.
 - 1. Eternity, Antichrist, Holy Spirit.
 - 2. The resurrection is well documented.
- D. The resurrection of Jesus had "eyewithess" testimony.
 - 1. Well over 500 people of impeccable character.
 - People whose lives have been an influence on all the world for good.
- I. THE RESURRECTED JESUS WAS SEEN BY CEPHAS.
 - A. "and that he was seen of Cephas."
 - Luke 24:34 "The Lord indeed is risen and hath appeared to Simon."
 - 2. II Peter 1:15-16.
- II. THE RESURRECTED JESUS WAS SEEN OF THE TWELVE.
 - A. "then of the twelve."
 - 1. John 20:19-20.
 - 2. I John 1:1-4.
- III. THE FIVE HUNDRED WERE EYEWITNESSES. V6

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- A. "after that he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once."
 - 1. There is no specific record of this event.
 - 2. It may have been on the occasion of post-pentecost.
- B. Some of these were living.
 - 1. "Of whom the greater part remain unto this present day, but some are fallen asleep."
- IV. JAMES WITNESSED JESUS' RESURRECTION.
 - A. "after that he was seen of James."
 - 1. Neither does this event have further record.
 - The important fact is that the Corinthians Knew whom he meant.
 - B. "then of all the aposties."
 - 1. Acts 1:3.
 - 2. Post-resurrection training program.
- V. PAUL SAW THE RESURRECTED CHRIST.
 - A. "and last of all he was seen of me also, as of one born out of due season."
 - born = ektroma an untimely birth, "abortion."
 - Paul was a unique apostle, he did not follow the same pattern as the others.
 - He became an apostle but in a different and unique fashion.
- VI. PAUL DID NOT FEEL HIMSELF WORTHY OF BEING AN APOSTLE. UP
 - A. "for I am the least of the apostles, that I am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God."
 - 1. least = elachistos the least in magnitude.
 - meet = hikanos coming to, reaching to; hence sufficent, competent, adequate.

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3. For I belong to the lowest rank of the apostles, and am not deserving of the name "Apostle."

B. Why?

- 1. "I persecuted the church of God."
- The forgiveness of sin does not obliterate the memory of it.
- 3. The other apostles did not persecute.

VII. PAUL AND THE GRACE OF GOD. VIO

- A. Paul was not worthy, but God made him worthy.
 - i. "but by the grace of God I am what I am."
 - 2. God's bestowed grace empowered Paul.
- B. God used a laboring Paul.
 - "and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain."
 - a. vain = Kenos empty, referring to the contents of anything.
- C. "but I labored more abundantly than they all;"
 - 1. laboured Kopiao to be beat out, to be weary.
 - abundantly = peissoteros = above the over-above.
- D. "yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me."
 - Yet actually I wasn't doing it, but God worked through me, helping and blessing me.
 - 2. Again, Paul acknowledges God's power.

VIII. ALL OF THE APOSTLES PREACHED THE SAME GOSPEL.

A. "Therefore whether it were I or they, so we preach, and so ye believed."
