

A CHARGE TO KEEP

I Timothy 6:13-16

Intro:

- A. Timothy was to avoid the "gain is godliness" crowd.
 - 1. "But thou, O man of God, flee these things".
 - 2. "fight the good fight of faith".

- B. He had professed a good profession.
 - 1. Timothy had a good foundation.
 - 2. He had a good reputation.
 - 3. He should, "lay hold" to eternal things.
 - 4. Paul now gives him a charge to keep.

I. Paul's Charge To Timothy.

- A. Vs 13 "I give thee charge in the sight of God..."
 - 1. "Charge" = παραγγελλω = "to hand on an announcement from one to another", "to pass on the watchword"
 - 2. "Sight" = ενωπιον = "in the sight or presence of".

- B. "...who quickeneth all things..."
 - 1. "Quickeneth" = ζωοποιεω = "to make alive", "to give life", "to give eternal life".
 - 2. "The source of all life".

- C. "...and before Christ Jesus, who before Pontius Pilate witnessed a good profession."
 - 1. "Witnessed" = μαρτυρω = "to give witness".
 - 2. "Profession" = ομολογεω = "to speak or say the same with another".
 - 3. "...who in testifying before Pontius Pilate made his great confession." - GSPD

- D. Vs 14 "That thou keep this commandment without spot unrebukeable..."
 - 1. "Keep" = τηρω = "to watch over", "keep an eye on"
 - 2. "Commandment" = εντολη = "that which has been enjoined".

3. "Spot" = σπιλος = "a stain", "a mark".
 4. "Unrebukeable" = ανεπιληπτος = "not to be attacked", "taken, or apprehended".
- E. "...until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ."
1. "Appearing" = επιφανεια = "the shining upon".
 2. "Until the forthshining of..." - RHM
 3. "This is how long we should be faithful".

II. What Christ's Appearing Will Show.

- A. Vs 15 "Which in his times he shall shew..."
1. "Times" = καιρος = "the right time", "the suitable time", "the opportune point of time".
 2. "Shew" = δεικνυμι = "to point out", as with the finger.
- B. "...who is the blessed and only potentate..."
1. "Blessed" = μακαριος = "joyfully confident".
 2. "Potentate" = δυναστης = "one who exercised sovereignty in his own power".
 3. "...that blessed and only Sovereign" - MOF
- C. "...the King of kings, and Lord of lords."
1. "The king over all kings and the master of all masters" - PHI
 2. "The King of them that reign and Lord of them that wield lordship." - RHM
- D. Vs 16 "Who only hath immortality..."
1. αθανασια = "not able to die".
 2. "Who alone can never die" - TAY
- E. "...dwelling in the light which no man can approach unto;..."
1. "Dwelling" = οικεω = "to dwell", "inhabit".
 2. "Light" = φως
 3. "Approach" = απροσιτος = "unapproachable".
- F. "...whom no man hath seen, nor can see;..."
1. "The one whom no mortal eye has ever seen" PHI

2. John 6:46 - "Not that any man hath seen the Father, save he which is of God, he hath seen the Father."

G. "...to whom be honour and power everlasting. Amen."

1. "Honour" = τιμη = "to place as valuable".
2. "Power" = κρατος = "strength", "power in effect".
3. "Everlasting" = αιωνιος = "belonging to the ages"

III. Jesus Christ, The Way To God.

A. He has the credentials.

1. He was born of a woman.
2. He suffered life on earth.
3. He gave Himself a ransom.

B. He has the power.

1. He is immortal.
2. He is all-sufficient.
