Introduction:

- A. The busybodies are told to work and to earn their own bread.
 - Should Christians quit their jobs and just visit and knock on doors?
- B. What are the workers to do?
 - 1. The "busybodies" can discourage God's people.
- I. KEEP ON KEEPING ON. V13
 - A. Sometimes the faithful are distracted by the busybodies.
 - 1. The undisciplined get more attention.
 - 2. Babies need more care.
 - B. Don't let this get you down.
 - 1. Don't get fed up with baby-sitting!
 - 2. Keep on doing well.
- II. HOW TO DEAL WITH THE DISOBEDIENT. V14
 - A. "If any man obey not our word by this epistle."
 - obey not = the letter is read but the busybody will not obey.
 - 2. "our word by this letter."
 - a. This very writing.
 - b. "Note that man."
 - 1. note = mark him out for yourselves.
 - 2. Some form of congregational identification.
 - C. "Have no company with him."
 - no company = not to be mixing yourselves up with them.

- No association with the man as a close and acceptable friend. Group disapproval through social ostracism.
- D. "That he may be ashamed."
 - ashamed = to be turned in upon oneself.
 - The social pressure is applied to make him aware of the congregations disapproval.

III. DON'T BE TOO HARSH. V15

- A. "Count him not as an enemy."
 - 1. Don't do it as an enemy but...
- B. "Admonish him as a brother."
 - Let him Know there is wrong but do not turn your back on him.

 - A. We would think it would mean great war!
