 - 2. guard = is a military term.
- II. "WE HAVE CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD TOUCHING YOU."
 - A. "that you do ... the things which we command."
 - confidence = to persuade, win by words, influence.
 - command = to announce beside or near to anyone, to hand an announcement, then to pass it on.
 - B. "and will do ... the things which we command."
 - 1. There are still things to learn and do.
