TIMOTHY, DEARLY BELOVED SON

II Tim 1:1-7

Intro:

- A. This is the last of Paul's letters.
 - 1. It is written from prison.
 - 2. The date is 64-68 A.D.
- B. The signature.
 - 1. Vs 1 "Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ..."
 - 2. "...by the will of God..."
 - 3. "...according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus."
 - 4. Paul was called to be an Apostle. It was God's will. He was to, "make known the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus".
- C. Vs 2 "To Timothy, my dearly beloved son:..."
 - 1. "Beloved" = $\alpha\gamma\alpha\pi\eta\tau\sigma$ = "that which comes from a deliberate decision".
 - 2. " \underline{Son} " = TEKVOV = "that which is born", Here it is a term of endearment".
- D. "...Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord."
 - 1. "Grace" = $\chi \alpha \rho \iota \varsigma$ = "favor".
 - 2. "Mercy" = $\epsilon \lambda \epsilon \circ \varsigma$ = "help".
 - 3. "Peace" = $\epsilon \iota \rho \eta \nu \eta$ = "absence of strife".
 - 4. These all come from and have to do with God, not men.

I. Paul Prayed For Timothy. Vs 3

- A. "I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers with pure conscience,..."
 - 1. "Thank" = $\varepsilon v \chi \alpha \rho \iota \sigma \tau \epsilon \omega$ = "to show one's self grateful".
 - 2. "Serve" = $\lambda \alpha T \rho \in U \omega$ = "to render service to God".
 - 3. "Pure" = $K\alpha\theta\alpha\rho\sigma$ = "free from every admixture".

- 4. "Conscience" = $\sigma u \nu \in l \delta \eta \sigma l S$ = "being one's own witness".
- 5. "When I serve with a clear conscience in the way my fathers taught me." KNOX
- 6. How did Paul accomplish this? Acts 20:26-27
- B. "...that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day;"
 - 1. "Ceasing" = $\alpha \delta i \alpha \lambda \in i \pi ToS = "without interruption".$
 - 2. "Remembrance" = $\mu \in \nu \iota \alpha$ = "memory", "mention".
 - 3. "Prayers" = $\delta \in \eta \sigma \iota \varsigma$ = "the expression of need".

III. The Substance Of Paul's Prayers. Vs 4

- A. "Greatly desiring to see thee,..."
 - 1. "Desiring" = $\epsilon \pi \iota \pi \circ \theta \epsilon \omega$ = "to yearn after".
 - 2. "I have a great longing to see you".
- B. "...being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy;"
 - 1. "<u>Mindful</u>" = μιμνησκομαι = "to remind one's self".
 - 2. "...when I remember the tears you shed".
 - 3. "...that I may feel deep joy".

III. Timothy Had A Pure Faith. Vs 5

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- A. "When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee,..."
 - 1. "Remembrance" = $\dot{\nu}\pi o \mu \nu \eta \sigma \iota \varsigma$ = "reminder" It is a word that expresses the use of an external reminder.

 - 3. "I am calling up memories of your sincere and unqualified..." AMP
- B. "...which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice;..."
 - 1. "Dwelt" = $\epsilon \nu OlK \epsilon \omega$ = "to live in".

- 2. "that found a home in".
- C. "...and I am persuaded that in thee also."
 - 1. "Persuaded" = $\pi \in \iota \theta \omega$ = "to be totally convinced".
 - 2. "...and I surely believe...".

IV. Timothy Had A Special Gift. Vs 6

- A. "Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God,..."
 - 1. "Remembrance" = $\alpha \nu \alpha \mu \iota \mu \nu \eta \sigma \kappa \omega$ = "to cause to remember".
 - 2. "Stir up" = $\alpha\nu\alpha\zeta\omega\pi\nu\rho\epsilon\omega$ = "to keep at full flame" Fires were never kept at full flame, but as beds of coals. They were then fanned to full flame when needed.
 - 3. "Gift" = $\chi \alpha \rho \iota \sigma \mu \alpha$ = "grace gift".
- B. "...which is in thee by the putting on of my hands."
 - "Which came upon you when I laid my hands on you"
 WMS
 - 2. I Timothy 4:14
 - 3. This was one of the spirituals, perhaps it had to do with ministering.

V. Timothy's Gift Was Not Fear. Vs 7

- A. "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear..."
 - 1. "Not the spirit of cowardice" ALF
 - 2. "For the spirit that God has given us does not impart timidity."
- B. "...but of power, and of love..."
 - 1. "Power" = δυναμις = "inherent power to perform".
 - 2. "Love" = $\alpha \gamma \alpha \pi \eta S$ = "love".
- C. "...and of a sound mind."
 - 1. σωφρονισμος = "self-discipline", "the power to keep one's self-control", "free from the influence of the excitement of the moment."
