12. He believed it to be a, "house of prayer".

13. Jesus was Jealous of it. He defended it

by word and deed.

B. Jesus was fervently opposed by those who were involved in the Temple's ministry.

11. It was the Temple's ministry, Not Gods.

12. The Sectarian groups sought His destruction.

13. The Phanisees, the Herodians, the Sadduces, the Lawyers, the Scribes, all plotted against Him.

[2. In these teachings He speaks specifically to the scribes, (35-37), to the crowd, 38-40, and to the disciples, 41-44.

I. Actions Don't Always Speak Louder Than Wonds.

(To The Scribes)

[A. And Jesus answered and said, while he taught in the temple, How say the scribes that Christ is the son of David".

U. The scribes were saying that Jesus was not the Messiah because His actions were not consistent with those of David.
