## Jesus Before Pontius Pilate

#### Matthew 27:1-26

#### Intro:

## A. Jesus appeared before Caiaphas, the High Priest.

- 1. He gathered the full council.
- 2. They ultimately found two false witnesses.
- 3. They accused Him of blasphemy.
- 4. They physically abused him.

#### B. Jesus was then delivered to Pilate.

- 1. The chief priests and elders took council on how they might put Jesus to death. **V.1**
- 2. They were afraid to stone Him to death as the charge of blasphemy demanded.
- 3. They decided to use the Roman system. V.2

## I. The Repentance Of Judas.

# A. Judas saw Jesus taken away.

- repented = μεταμελομαι = "to regret" 'to have dissatisfaction with one's self for what one has done," "to have pain of mind rather than change of mind." "Seller's remorse", "buyer's remorse." V.3
- 2. He attempted to change his grief by giving back the price of betrayal.

### B. His reason for repenting.

- 1. "I have betrayed the innocent blood." v.4
- 2. innocent =  $\alpha\theta\omega$ os = "not deserving punishment"
- 3. He received no sympathy.

#### C. His acts of contrition.

- 1. "He cast down the pieces...in the temple." V.5
- 2. "...he departed"
- 3. "...went and hanged himself"

### D. The chief priest's dilemma.

- 1. It was money paid for a man's life. V.6
- 2. It could not be put in the treasure boxes.

### E. Bad money for a good cause.

1. The land was cheap because those who made pottery had exhausted its worth. **V.7** 

- 2. The Gentiles that came to Jerusalem could not be buried with Jews.
- 3. The name reflects the fact of it being purchased with the money used to buy a man's life. V.8

## F. A fulfilling of prophecy.

- 1. This prophecy is not in Jeremiah but in Zechariah. Probably a copyist's error.
- 2. Zechariah 11:12-13
- 3. Zechariah was sent to the Jews. He was to tell them the truth. They did not receive him but treated him with contempt. They were asked to place a price on his services. They put the price of a slave to ridicule him. God told him to cast it into the pottery or trash. Jesus was received by Israel the same way.

## II. Jesus Before Pilate.

- A. His appearance before Herod is not mentioned.
  - 1. Luke 23:6-12
- B. Jesus questioned.
  - 1. "Art thou the King of the Jews?" v.11
  - 2. "Thou sayest."
- C. The response.
  - 1. "...he answered nothing." V.12
  - 2. "...hearest thou not...?" v.13
  - 3. "...he answered him never a word." V.14
  - 4. His demeanor amazed the governor.

#### III. The Multitudes Bad Choice. 27:15

- A. The custom of the feast.
  - 1. They would release a prisoner. V.15
  - 2. Barabbas was a seditionist and murderer. Luke 23:25
  - 3.  $envy = \phi\theta ovos = "Jealousy of another's success," "envy of another's excellence."$ **V.18**
- B. A warning from his wife.
  - "...this just man." V.19
  - 2. "I have suffered many things..."

# C. The multitudes choice.

- 1. They persuaded the multitudes. Vs.20,21,22
- 2. "...destroy Jesus."
- 3. "What shall I do with Jesus..."
- 4. "Let him be crucified."
- 5. Pilate's intercession.
- 6. "...what evil hath he done?" v.23
- 7. His disclaimer. (washed hands) v.24
- 8. The multitudes horrible assumption. **V.25**
- 9. Their desire granted. **V.26**
