Matthew 26:1-16

Intro:

A. Things begin and things end.

- 1. We have studied the beginning of the ministry of Christ.
- 2. Not his beginning, for He is from eternity.

B. Here we begin to see the conclusion of His earthly ministry.

- 1. Though He dies, it is not His end.
- 2. His ministry is transferred from earth to heaven.

I. The Plan Of God.

A. Jesus finished His teaching ministry. Vs.1-2

- 1. "...finished all these sayings..."
- 2. he continues to teach them of His death.
- 3. He had taught this before. Matthew 16:21

B. The plan stated. V.2

- 1. "...the son of man is betrayed..."
- 2. "...to be crucified..."

II. The Plot Of Men.

A. The gathering. Vs.3-5

- 1. assembled = $\sigma v \alpha \gamma \omega$ = "to bring together"
- "...chief priests, the scribes, the elders of the people, the palace of the high priest."
- 3. They did not gather in a dark alley.

B. Their plan. V.4

- They already knew what they wanted, to kill Jesus.
- 2. consulted = συμβουλευω = "to counsel together," "for evil, to plot."
- 3. subtlety = $\delta o \lambda o s$ = "bait" "guile, deceit"
- 4. $kill = \alpha \pi o \kappa \tau \epsilon i \nu \omega = to slay, kill outright$
- 5. They feared a public outcry. V.5

III. The Prophecy Of A Woman.

A. The act of faith.

- 1. She was a guest, a woman. Vs.6-7
- 2. She poured a very expensive ointment on the head of Jesus.

B. The indignation of the disciples.

- indignation = αγανακτεω = to feel a violent physical irritation, to be vexed, annoyed.
 Vs.8-9
- 2. $purpose = \epsilon is \tau i = to what end?$
- waste = απολεια = "destruction, waste"
- 4. The noble purpose sighted. V.9
- 5. Evil people still cloak bad deeds in good works, casino gambling, lotteries, bingo.

C. The disappointment of Jesus.

- 1. $\frac{\text{understood}}{\text{into"}} = \gamma \iota \nu \omega \sigma \kappa \omega = \text{``to receive insight into"}$ ``to know and be influenced by that knowledge." **V.10**
- 2. He identified the act as a good work.
- 3. There is always opportunity to do good. V.11
- 4. It was an act of faith. V.12
- 5. It would not be forgotten.
- 6. memorial = ειs μνημοσυνον = "a view to", + "a monument, commemorative."

IV. The Price Of Betrayal.

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A. Judas and the chief priests.

- 1. "What will you give me"? v.14-15
- 2. Perhaps Judas is motivated to do this because of the anointing of Jesus.
- 3. John 12:4-6
- 4. Also he may have been one of the few disciples (followers) who believed Jesus would go to Jerusalem and die.
- 5. The price, 30 pieces of silver.

B. The work of the wicked.

- 1. opportunity = $\varepsilon v \kappa \alpha i \rho i \alpha = \text{"fit time"} v.16$
- 2. $\underline{\text{betray}} = \pi \alpha \rho \alpha \delta i \delta \omega \mu i = \text{``to give over into another's hands.''}$

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
