- A. We know that God loves the world.
 - 1. "For God so loved the world..."
 - 2. "that He gave His only begotten Son..."
- B. We know that God will have all men to be saved.
 - "...not willing that any should perish..."
 Peter 3:9
 - 2. "who will have all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth." 1 Timothy 2:3-4
- C. We are to witness to all men.
 - 1. "...and ye shall be witness unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Acts 1:8
 - 2. "Go ye therefore and teach all nations..."
 Matthew 28:19
- D. We know that all men will not be saved.
 - There are those who, "believe not". John 3:36
 - There are, "few there be that find it." Matthew 7:14
- E. How shall we do what our Lord commands?
 - 1. This is not a take it or leave it statement.
 - 2. We must attempt to do it.
- I. The Plain Statement Of Jesus.
 - A. "Give not that which is holy unto the dogs..." v.6
 - 1. give not = $\delta\iota\delta\omega\mu\iota$ = "to give freely," "commit"
 - 2. holy = $\alpha \gamma ios$ = "sacred and clean."
 - 3. "you must never give the things that are sacred to the dogs" Wms.
 - 4. $dogs = \kappa v \omega v = "dogs"$
 - 5. What is the "holy" and what are the "dogs"?
 - B. "neither cast ye your pearls before swine,"

- 1. cast = $\beta\alpha\lambda\lambda\omega$ = "to throw at or hit."
- 2. "You must never throw your pearls before hogs." Wms
- 3. What are "pearls" and what are "swine".

C. Why?

- 1. "lest they trample them under their feet"
- "and turn again and rend you."
- 3. trample = $\kappa \alpha \tau \alpha \pi \alpha \tau \epsilon \omega$ = "to tread down"
- 4. rend = $\rho\eta\gamma\nu\nu\mu$ = "to break," "shatter"

II. What Did Jesus Mean?

A. This seems to fit the concept of the Jewish proverb.

- 1. "He that reproveth a scorner" Proverbs 9:7-8
- 2. "He that rebuketh a wicked man..."
- 3. "Reprove not a scorner, lest he hate thee..."

B. Men and nations may cross a line that God has set and only God can see.

- 1. "Ephraim is joined to idols: Let him alone."
- 2. The Pharisees. Matthew 15:10-14

C. Jesus spoke of those who will not hear and will not see.

- 1. Matthew 13:13-16
- 2. Sending forth the 12. Matthew 10:5-15
- 3. Sending forth the 70. Luke 10:1-12

D. Paul and Barnabas encountered some who contradicted and blasphemed God's word.

- 1. contradicting = αντιλεγω = "to speak against"
- 2. $\frac{\text{unworthy}}{13:44-46} = \text{not } \alpha \xi \text{ios} = \text{worth, value Acts}$
- 3. vs. 50-51

III. Some Things To Consider.

A. We should witness to all men.

- 1. Those who show interest.
- 2. Those who may not show anger.

B. We should be faithful and lovingly patient with those who show interest.
