# Matthew 25:1-13

#### Intro:

- Jesus taught His disciples that He would return to this earth.
  - This was in response to their question.
  - "...What shall be the sign of thy coming..." 2.
- His disciples do not know the day or the hour.
  - It will be as a thief to those who do not look for His appearing.
  - His disciples are to be ready. V.44
  - They must not assume His return is being 3. V.48 delayed.
- Not all servants will be ready. C.
  - There are faithful servants. 1.
  - There are evil servants. 2.
- D. Being ready involves two things.
  - Understanding the signs.
  - Making definite preparation.
- The Parable Of The Ten Virgins. I.
  - The comparison Jesus made. V.25
    - $likened = o\mu o to \omega = "to make like," "compare"$
    - The Kingdom of Heaven is compared to the 2. circumstances described in verses 45-51 of chapter 24.
    - It is the time of the Lord's return. 3.
    - v.25
    - This is the narrow scope of the comparison. 5.
  - Things that are different. В.
    - Five of them are wise. 1.
    - Five of them are foolish. 2.
    - wise =  $\phi$ povi $\mu$ os = understanding, thoughtful, 3. practically wise, sensible, prudent. (Not σοφοs, which is clever, skilled, sophisticated.)
    - foolish =  $\mu\omega\rho\sigma$ s = dull, not acute, from root = to be silly, one who does not think ahead.
    - The foolish took no extra oil.  $\mathbf{v.3}$ 5.

- 6. The wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps. **V.4**
- 7. <u>vessel</u> =  $\alpha\gamma\gamma\epsilon tov$  = a small container, on which oil was carried to replenish torches and lamps.
- 8. The five wise virgins went to the marriage. **V.10**
- 9. The five foolish virgins did not go. Vs.11-12

### C. Things that are the same.

- 1. They are all virgins.
- 2. They all had lamps.
- 3. They all had oil in their lamps.
- 4. All ten lamps were lighted and burning. V.8
- 5. They all trimmed their lamps. V.7
- 6.  $trimmed = \kappa o \sigma \mu \epsilon \omega = to put in order, to adjust.$
- 7. They all slumbered and slept. This is not an evil deed! **V.5**
- 8. They all heard the same cry. Vs.6-7

## D. The point of emphasis.

- The wise had thought and planned ahead. They had extra containers of oil. This prepared them for a longer wait than expected.
- 2. The foolish had not planned ahead. They did not have a container of oil.
- 3. As they waited for the bridegroom their lamps began to flicker. They realized their predicament. The wise could not share their oil. Why? Galatians 6:5 "...for every man shall bear his own burden." We cannot get ready for someone else, only ourselves.
- 4. The bridegroom came! The wise went into the hose with him.
- 5. The foolish had gone to Wal-Mart to buy a container of oil. When they returned they sought admission to the wedding. They were refused. They suffered loss.

#### E. The heart of the parable.

- 1. We do not know the day of His return. V.13
- 2. We do not know the hour of His return.
- 3. We do know He will return.
- 4. WE do know the season of His return.
