- A. We learn many lessons from many things.
  - 1. Some are easy, some are difficult.
  - 2. Some are, "the school of hard knocks."
  - 3. Life is a series of lessons and learning.
- B. Jesus the Master Teacher.
  - 1. He taught in the Temple at age 12.
  - 2. He taught in the synagogues.
  - 3. He taught in the meadows and fields.
  - 4. He taught as He traveled.
  - 5. Here, we learn the lesson of the fig tree.
- I. The Lessons Of The Fig Tree.
  - A. That Jesus was human. V.18
    - 1. The Bible states that, he hungered.
    - 2. We saw this in His temptation.
  - B. That Jesus took what was set before Him.
    - 1. "...he saw a fig tree." V.19
    - 2. He did not reject its fruit.
  - C. That things aren't always what they seem.
    - 1. "...he found nothing thereon."
    - 2. "...leaves only."
    - 3. The fig tree bloomed first, set its fruit and then put forth its leaves.
    - 4. Because it was already in full leaf, it was past putting on fruit. Mark 11:12-14
  - D. That God sometimes works quickly.
    - "...and presently the fig tree withered."
       V.19
    - 2. presently = παραχραμα = "with the thing
      itself", "at the very moment",
       "directly"
  - E. That God's people are slow to learn.
    - 1. The disciples saw it. V.20
    - 2. They marveled.

- 3. Unwavering faith in God and His commands is necessary to doing such acts.

# B. The great promise. V.22

- 3.  $\frac{\text{receive}}{\text{of", "to take is given."}}$  "to take hold
