Intro:

- A. Jesus condemned the Pharisees for attributing His miracles to Satanic power.
 - 1. "but...by the prince of the devils."
 - 2. "blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven thee."
- B. Certain of these persons requested a sign from Jesus. They seem to say that they had not received sufficient evidence that Jesus was indeed the Messiah.
 - sign = σημείον = "a sign by which anything is designated, distinguished, or known." V.38
 - 2. They required more information.
- I. Jesus Answers The Scribes And Pharisees.
 - A. The character of sign-seekers. V.39a
 - 1. They are evil and unfaithful.
 - 2. They remain true to Israel's past.
 - B. The sign they will see. V.39b
 - 1. It is in their future.
 - 2. It comes from their past. V.40
 - C. People in the past responded to the truth of God, even Gentiles.
 - 1. Nineveh; Jonah, a greater than Jonah. V.41
 - The Queen of Sheba received the wisdom of Solomon, Jesus is greater than Solomon. V.42
- II. Those Who Remain Almost Persuaded May Worsen Their Circumstances.
 - A. The unclean spirit in a man. V.43
 - 1. It goes out of a man when the man's heart is quickened by truth.
 - 2. When a man's conscience is awakened to the possibility that Jesus may be Messiah.
 - 3. It wonders in the barren places.
 - B. The unclean spirit returns to (my) house. V.44

- 1. He finds it empty, swept, and garnished.
- 2. This speaks of a person being uncommitted toward the person of Christ.
- 3. The unclean spirit finds seven other spirits even more wicked. **V.45**
- 4. They enter in and dwell there.

C. The worse state of the Pharisees. V.46

- 1. Jesus applies the illustration.
- 2. "and that is the same thing that will happen to all of you who won't believe and blaspheme the Holy Spirit and demand more information."
