# The Twelve Are Sent Forth

#### Matthew 10:1-15

#### Intro:

- A. The preaching of the Kingdom in chronology.
  - 1. John the Baptist preached it.
  - 2. Jesus preached it.
  - 3. Now, twelve more will preach it.
- B. Jesus has described the circumstances. 9:37
  - 1. The harvest truly is plenteous.
  - 2. The laborers are few.
- C. Jesus had been moved with compassion. 9:36
  - 1. He saw that the multitudes were weary.
  - He was them scattered.
- D. Jesus enlarges the number of workers. V.1
  - 1. called =  $\pi pook \alpha \lambda s \omega$  = "to call to one's self"
  - 2.  $\underline{\text{disciples}} = \mu \alpha \theta \eta \tau \eta s = \text{``a learner''}, \text{``one who follows both the teacher and the teaching.''}$
  - 3. gave =  $\delta\iota\delta\omega\mu\iota$  = "to give freely"
  - 4. <u>power</u> = εξουσια = "delegated authority," "liberty."
  - 5. <u>unclean</u> = ακαθαρτος = "unpurified," "unatoned as in a Levitical sense."
  - 6. cast out =  $\varepsilon \kappa \beta \alpha \lambda \lambda \omega$  = "to throw out"
  - 7. heal =  $\theta \epsilon \rho \alpha \pi \epsilon \nu \omega$  = "to take care of the sick"
  - 8. sickness = vocos = "confirmed disease"
  - 9.  $\underline{\text{disease}} = \mu \alpha \lambda \alpha \kappa \alpha = \text{"incipient complaint"}$
- E. The twelve are chosen and sent.
  - 1. vs.2-4
  - 2. Mark 3:14 = ordained =  $\pi o \iota \epsilon \omega$  = "to cause"
  - 3. Luke 6:13 "whom he also named apostles."
- I. Jesus Tells Them Where Not To Go.
  - A. "These twelve Jesus sent foth, and commanded them saying," v.5
    - sent forth = αποστελλω = "to equip and dispatch upon a certain mission", "commission."

- 2. commanded = παραγγελλω = "to announce beside or near to anyone", "to give the word," "give orders." Acts 10:42
- B. "...Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not:"
  - "Don't turn off into any of the heathen roads..." - Phi
  - The Samaritans were a mixed group.
- II. Jesus Tells Them Where To Go And What To Do.
  - A. "But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." V.6
    - 1. Matthew 15:24 "a woman of Canaan..."
    - 2. Acts 3:25-26
    - 3. Matthew 21:43 "The kingdom of God shall be taken from you."
  - B. "And as ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. V.7
    - preach = κηρυσσω = "to be a herald,"
       "proclaim"
    - 2. "The reign of heaven is near..." Mof
  - C. What they were to do.
    - 1. "Heal the sick"
    - 2. "Cleanse the lepers."
    - 3. "raise the dead"
    - 4. "cast out devils"
    - 5. freely =  $\delta\omega\rho\epsilon\alpha\nu$  = "as a free gift."
- III. Personal Provisions For The Preachers.
  - A. The things not to take. V.9
    - 1. gold, silver, or even copper money.
    - No bag, extra coat or extra shoes, or a staff. V.10a.
  - B. The preachers pay. V.10b
    - 1. workman =  $\epsilon \rho \gamma \alpha \tau \eta s$  = "a laborer"
    - 2. worthy=  $\alpha \xi \cos =$  "worth", deserving"
    - 3. 1 Corintians 9:14 "...they that preach the gospel shall live of the gospel..."
- IV. The Plan For The Preachers.

## A. A place to stay. V.11

- 1. "inquire who in it is worthy"
- 2. Go into any city or town, ask who is deserving, and make his house your home as long as you are in the city or town.
- 3. <u>inquire</u> =  $\varepsilon \xi \varepsilon \tau \alpha \zeta \omega$  = "to examine," "to question"

### B. A place to teach. V.12

- 1. <u>salute</u> = ασπαζομαι = "to draw to one's self,"
  "to embrace", "to greet."
- 2. "...say, may peace be on this house." Bas
- 3. They decide to hear or not to hear the words of truth. Hearing makes them worthy. **V.13**

#### C. Those who are not worthy. V.14

- 1.  $\underline{\text{receive}} = \delta \epsilon \chi o \mu \alpha i$  = "to take to one's self what is presented or brought by another", "to admit hospitably". It implies a subjective reception showing that a decision of the will has taken place with respect to the object offered.
- 2.  $\underline{\text{hear}} = \alpha \kappa \omega \omega = \text{to listen, to learn by hearing.}$
- 3. "shake off the dust of your feet."

#### D. God will judge those who will not hear. V.15

- 1. "and whosoever shall not receive you..."
- 2. tolerable = ανεκτοs = "endurable",
   "supportable."
- 3. Sodom and Gomorra will have a more supportable argument for what they did than these cities will for what they have done.

# V. Are These Examples For Us To Follow?

## A. No. This was for one time and one place.

- 1. It was very limited in its geographical scope.
- 2. It was brief in its existence.
- 3. It was specific in its commandments.

# B. The commission we labor under is a great deal different.

- 1. We are not limited geographically.
