## HOW TO DEAL WITH TROUBLE IN THE CHURCH PHIL 4:2-3

## Introduction:

- A. Sometimes we avoid or gloss over Scriptures that touch on sensitive truths.
  - 1. We are willing to preach about Hell.
  - 2. We can speak about the second coming.
- B. Paul interrupts his exhortations to deal with a very sensitive problem in the church at Philippi.
  - 1. Two women in the church were having a problem.
  - 2. Paul knew such a problem would distrub and hinder. It is a fact that:

## I. THE CHURCH AT PHILIPPI HAD A PROBLEM. V2

- A. "I exhort Euodia and I exhort Syntyche, to make up your differences as Christians should."
  - 1. We do not know the nature of their problem.
  - 2. It was not doctrinal, Paul would have settled it.
  - 3. It was not moral, Paul would have spoken of it.
  - 4. It was something personal, between these two.
  - 5. It was a problem, only as they made it one.
- B. They were both good women, workers for the Lord.
  - 1. "help those women who labored with me in the gospel"
  - 2. When Paul first came, they labored with him.
    - a. Acts 16:13 "And on the Sabbath we went out of the city by a river side, where prayer was wont to be made; and we sat down, and spake unto the women that resorted thither."
- C. Many churches owe their existence to the women and not the men.
  - 1. If the wise quits, the husband quits.
  - These two women were probably the first in the church.

- D. What the problem was we don't know, it was the fact of its existence that hindered the work.
  - 1. Don't let minor things hinder the church.
  - 2. The church is more important than personal ideas.
- E. It was not to be ignored!
  - "and I solemnly beg you my true comrade, help them to be reconciled."
    - a. It was to be dealt with according to the Bible.
    - b. Did Paul Know. Matt. 18:
    - c. Don't take sides, show them the Scriptures, pray
- II. HOW TO DEAL WITH THIS PROBLEM. MATT. 18:15-17.
  - A. The offended is to make the first move.
    - 1. Prevents a long time period.
    - 2. The offender may not know they have offended.
  - B. The offense can be taken care of by two people only.
    - 1. "go and tell him his fault between thee and and him alone."
    - 2. Some say, "I don't want to cause trouble!"
    - 3. To not do as the Bible teaches, causes trouble.
  - C. This is God's way, it will work!
    - 1. You can trust the Lord.
    - 2. No one has ever been harmed by doing what is right.
  - D. They had something to rejoice about.
    - 1. "whose names are in the book of life."
