# THE WORK OF CHRIST PHIL. 2:25-30

#### Introduction:

- A. The title may be misleading, this message has to do with our work for Christ, not His work for us.
  - 1. v30.
  - 2. It is "the work," same as "the way," "the man," "the book."
- B. In these verses we see how many different people were involved in "the work of Christ."
  - 1. Paul, apostle and missionary.
  - 2. Epaphroditus, a servant of Philippians.
  - 3. The Philippian church.
- C. Their work was different and yet it was the same.
  - It was not, "Paul's work," or Epaphroditus' work, or the Philippian churches work, it was Christ's work.
  - 2. It is the same idea expressed to the Ephesians.
  - 3. Eph. 4:1-4.
  - 4. There are "ones" but they are all to be a unit "for the work of Christ."
- I. PAUL, PREACHER, APOSTLE, SERVANT OF JESUS TOUSET.
  - A. Paul had come to them with the gospel.
    - 1. Acts 16:11-12.
    - 2. The Philippian Jailer.
  - B. These people had never forgotten Paul.
    - 1. Phil. 4:15-18.
    - He had sacrificed to preach, they in turn sacrificed that he might preach.

## II. EPAPHRODITUS, A WORK FOR JESUS.

- A. What he was to Paul.
  - Paul did not use the same words to describe his relationship to epaphroditus as he did to Timothy.
    - a. Likeminded, "same souled" = v20
    - b. Paul did not say things that were not true.
    - c. All men are not preachers, all preachers are not equal in ability.
  - 2. He was Paul's brother.
  - 3. He was Paul's "companion in labor."
  - 4. He was Paul's "fellow-soldier."
- B. What he was to the church.
  - 1. "your messenger."
  - 2. messenger = apostle = ambassador, envoy.
  - 3. This in no way detracts from his position, he was in his place doing his part in, "the work of Christ."
  - 4. He carried money to Paul, Paul thought it important.
- C. He was a brave and devoted man.
  - 1. He risked his life to serve. v30
  - It doesn't say he wasn't afraid, but he did the work anyway.
  - 3. "not regard," not to care for, neglect.
  - 4. Acts 15:25-27.
  - 5. They are referred to as, "gamblers," or riskers.
  - Acts, "hazarded," "to hand over to another."
- D. He was a kind and considerate man.
  - 1. v26.
  - He was sick but he was concerned about their grief for him.
  - 3. He did not use his illness to punish them.

- E. He was an honest man, he was really sick. v27a.
  - He was sick, "nigh unto death."
  - Not homesick, but really sick.
- F. He was a praying man.
  - 1. It doesn't say he prayed, but do you doubt it!
  - 2. It doesn't say Paul prayed, but do you doubt it!
  - 3. God had mercy on him and Paul.
    - a. Our lives are tied together.
    - Paul sent him promptly, because his life was an answer to prayer. v28.
    - c. If we pray for something and God grants it, we better use it the way we prayed!

#### IV. THE CHURCH WAS TO HONOR HIM. V19

- A. "receive him in the Lord with gladness."
  - 1. "give him a hearty Christian welcome."
  - Express your joy to him!
- B. "and hold such an one in reputation."
  - 1. "hold in honor and respect."
  - 2. Honor him for his act of bravery.
