THINGS THAT GO TOGETHER PHIL. 1:27-30

Introduction:

- A. Paul has assured the Philippians of his state.
 - 1. He knew his life would count for Christ. v21
 - 2. He had confidence in God. v25
- B. Paul encouraged them to display certain positive and negative Christian characteristics.
 - He reminds them that certain traits or actions complement one another.
 - 2. Really, things that go together.

I. SALVATION AND STEADFASTNESS. V27

- A. "only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ."
 - conversation = a member of a free city or state, to conduct one's self according to all the laws and customs of a state, hence to order one's life and conduct.
 - 2. becometh = weighing as much, of equal value.
 - 3. "Let there be an equal balance of what you profess and what you do."
- B. "that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs."
 - 1. "when the cat is away, the mice will play."
 - Paul wanted them to do right regardless of where he happened to be.
 - In their midst or in prison.
 - 4. Some believe they hide from God when they hide from the preacher!
- C. What were they to do?
 - 1. "that ye stand fast in one spirit."

- 2. "that ye stand firm animated by one spirit."
- 3. "that .. with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel."
- 4. "and with one mind, fighting shoulder to shoulder for the faith of the gospel."

II. SALVATION AND SERENITY. U28

- A. "and in nothing terrified by your adversaries."
 - 1. nothing no or not one.
 - 2. Negatives a supposition, and prohibits or forbids.
 - 3. "never be scared for a moment by your opponents."
 - "not for a moment intimidated."
- B. Serenity in the face of adversity is token of two things.
 - 1. "which is to them an evident token of perdition."
 - a. token = a pointing out with a finger."
 - b. "your fearlessness is like a finger pointing them out as ones who will suffer utter and final ruin, which will not be reversed."
 - 2. "but to you of salvation, and that of God."
 - a. "But to you it will be a sure finger of God pointing out your salvation."
 - b. If God is, and we are His, we must bear His displeasure more than man's.

III. SALVATION AND SUFFERING. V29-30

- A. God, for Christ's sake has granted unto us, two things:
 - 1. ... to have faith in him.
 - a. This is saving faith.
 - 2. ...to undergo pain (but also to suffer).
 - a. suffer = to be affected by anything from without, to be acted on, to experience.
 - b. To suffer from things evil.

- B. They had seen this happen to Paul. v30
 - "Take your part in the same struggle that you have seen me engage in."
 - 2. "we are in this fight together.. you have seen me suffer for Him in the past."
- IV. SOME THINGS GO TOGETHER. DON'T ASK FOR THEM TO BE SEPARATED IN YOUR LIFE.
 - A. Salvation and steadfastness.
 - 1. If we are saved, let us be steadfast.
 - 2. Do not ask to be excused from your burden.
 - B. Salvation and serenity.
 - 1. If we name His name, let us show no fear.
 - People judge God by the way His children act.
 - C. Salvation and suffering.
 - 1. We are not above our Master.
 - 2. Why should we expect our lives to be different.
