- C. These are true martyrs, of the church age.
 - 1. Not simply die but die for a cause.
 - 2. They have their glorified bodies.
- I. THE OPENING OF THE FIFTH SEAL, V9
 - A. "And when he had opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of them slain for the word of God, and for the testimony they held."
 - 1. under = hupokato down under, underneath.
 - altar = thusiasterion an altar, place for sacrifice.
 - souls = psuche one of the manifestations of life.
 - slain = sphazo to slaughter, to slay, as in animals for a sacrifice.
 - B. Why were these people slain?
 - 1. "for the word of God."
 - 2. "for the testimony they held."
 - testimony = marturia = certifies, a statement.
- II. THE CRY OF THE WITNESSES. V10

- A. "And they cried with a loud voice, saying, How long, 0 lord, holy and true, dost thou not judge and avenge our blood on them that dwell on the earth."
 - cried = drazo (a word that imitates the hoarse cry
 of the raven or crwo) onamatopoetic., hence to cry
 or cry out, inarticulate cries from fear or pain.
 - loud = megas great, large.
 - saying = lego to lay together, to relate.
- B. Their cry to God.
 - "how long?" ews = until + pote = when? At what time, until what time.
 - Lord = despotes despot one who has absolute dominion, supreme authority, and unlimited power.
 - a. Acts 4:24.
 - b. II Peter 2:1, "deny the Lord that bought them."
 - c. holy = hagios sacred, reverence, awe.
 - d. true = alethinos true, genuine.
 - 3. judge = Krino = to divide, to separate, to come to a decision, to pronounce final judgment.
 - avenge = ekdikeis = to execute vengeance.
 - a. Luke 17:34-37, 18:1-8.
 - b. Acts 7:24, "And seeing one of them suffer wrong, he [Moses] defended him and avenged him that was oppressed, and smote the Egyptian."
 - c. Rom. 12:19, "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath; for it is written vengeance is mine; I will repay,k saith the Lord."
 - d. Rev. 18:20, 19:2.
 - 5. dwell = katoikeo to dwell fixedly in a place.

III. GOD'S RESPONSE TO THE MARTYRS. U11

- A. "And white robes were given unto every one of them."
 - robes = stole = a long flowing robe, reaching to the feet, or train like.

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 - 2. given = didomi to give freely, unforced.
 - B. This by no means applies to every saved person!
 - 1. These were slain.
 - 2. They loved the truth more than their lives!
 - C. "and it was said unto them, that they should rest yet for a little season."
 - rest = anapauo to rest oneself, to take rest, to enjoy rest.
 - little = mikros small, little.
 - season = chronos = time, duration.
 - D. "until their fellowservants also and their brethren, that should be killed as they were, should be fulfilled"
 - 1. fellowservants = sundoulos = fellow slaves.
 - 2. killed = apokteino = to kill, to slay.
 - 3. fulfilled = pleroo to fill, to fulfill.
