THE SECOND, THIRD AND FOURTH TRUMPETS REV. 8:8-13

Introduction:

- A. The seventh seal of judgment consists of seven trumpets.
 - 1. They are further judgments on the earth.
 - 2. They fulfill some N.T. and some O.T. prophecy.
- B. This is the time of God's judgment.
 - 1. God has sent many messages and messengers.
 - 2. Last of all He sent His Son, to Israel.
 - 3. The church is His witnessing agent now.
- C. We have read of the first trumpet.
 - 1. Hail, Fire, Mingled with Blood.
 - 1/3 of the trees and, "all green grass."

I. THE SECOND TRUMPET SOUNDS. V8-9

- A. "And the second angel sounded, and as it were a great mountain burning with fire was cast into the sea."
 - mountain = horos = anything rising, a mountain, hill, height, chain of hills.
 - 2. burning = Kaio to be lighted, to burn.
 - 3. cast = ballo to throw or hit.
- B. "and the third part of the sea became blood."
 - 1. sea = thalassa a sea, the sea.
 - 2. blood = haima = blood.
 - 3. This probably means one sea, "the sea," turns as red as blood because of the huge missile from above being hurled into it.
- C. "and the third part of the creatures which were in the sea, and had life, died;"
 - 1. creatures = ktisea the thing created.
 - life = zoe = to breath the breathe of life.

- 3. died = apothnesko to die out, expire.
- D. "and the third part of ships were destroyed."
 - ships = ploion = a floating vessel, a ship for merchandise or transport.
 - destroyed = diaphtheiro = to corrupt completely, to decay wholly, to decay and perish.

II. THE THIRD TRUMPET SOUNDS. V10-11

- A. "And the third angel sounded, and there fell a great star from heaven, burning as it were a lamp."
 - star = aster = a star, a single star, spoken of fixed stars, planets, or meteors.
 - 2. burning = to be lighted, to burn.
 - lamp = lampas a torch fed from a little vessel constructed for the purpose.
 - a. Matt. 25:4, "But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps." lampas.
 - b. This star fell and burned for a period of time, longer than a "falling" star, as though it was fed by a source outside of itself.
- B. "and it fell upon the third part of the rivers, and upon the fountains of water."
 - fell = pipto to fall, as from a higher to lower.
 - The mountain was "cast," this star "fell!"
 - rivers = potamos = a river, a stream.
 - 4. fountains = pege = a spring, a well.
- C. And the name of the star is called wormwood; and the third part of the waters became wormwood."
 - name = onoma = the name by which a person or thing is called.
 - 2. wormwood = apsinthos It is called wormwood after the strong bitter taste of the plant of that name, specie = artemisia absinthium.

- 3. The star comes to be called wormwood because a third of all the fresh water on earth becomes noxious and bitter because of its fall.
- D. "and many men died of the waters; because they were made bitter."
 - 1. men = anthropon.
 - 2. many = polus = much.
 - 3. died = apothnesko to die out, to expire.
 - 4. bitter = pikraino = to make sharp, keen, or bitter to the taste.
 - We have no reason to believe this is Haley's Comet.

III. THE FOURTH TRUMPET SOUNDS. V12

- A. "And the fourth angel sounded, and the third part of the sun was smitten, and the third part of the moon, and the third part of the stars."
 - 1. third part = to triton = the triton.
 - sun = helios = the sun.
 - smitten = plesso = to strike, especially of a direct blow.
 - moon = selne = the moon.
 - stars = aster = stars.
- B. "so as the third part of them was darkened, and the day shone not for a third part of it, and the night likewise
 - darkened = skotizo to make dark, to deprive of light.
 - 2. A third of the stars went out or shined with only a part two thirds of their strength.
 - 3. The sun was darkened by one third.
 - And of course the moon's brightness would be diminished by one third.
 - 5. The earth would begin to grow colder!
 - 6. The irony of Rev. 16:8-9.
 - 7. Isaiah 13:6-11.

IV. THE WARNING OF GOD. V13

- A. "And I beheld, and heard an angel flying through the midst of heaven."
 - beheld = eidon = to see, is used of bodily sight
 - 2. heard = akouo to perceive with the ears.
 - 3. angel = aetos = eagle, or vulture.
 - 4. flying = petomai = to spread the wings to fly.
 - 5. midst = mesouranema the midst of the heaven.
- B. "saying with a loud voice, Woe, Woe, Woe, to the inhabitors of the earth by reason of the other voices of the trumpet of the angels, which are yet to sound."
 - Woe = ouai = a cry expressing grief.
 - inhabiters = katoikeo = to dwell in.
 - 3. reason = ek = out of = the source or occasion.
 - 4. There are three more trumpets to sound.
