GOALS WORTHY OF OUR PURSUIT Romans 14:19-23

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Paul has defined the Kingdom of God vs. 17
 - 1) "For the Kingdom of God is not meat and drink;"
 - 2) "but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost"
- B. These are the important things vs. 18
 - 1) "For he that in these things serveth Christ is acceptable [well pleasing] to God..."
 - 2) "and approved of men"
- C. Paul encourages the Romans to seek important goals to achieve.
 - 1) Special diets are not important
 - Not having special diets and days are of relative unimportance to the church.
- I. Pursue Peace And Edification verse 19
 - A. "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace,"
 - 1) "follow after" = $\delta \iota \omega \kappa \omega$ = "to pursue after as flying enemies", "pursue in order to overtake"
 - 2) "peace" = $\epsilon \iota \rho \eta \vee \eta =$ "at rest", "the end of and the absence of strife"
 - B. "and things wherewith one may edify another"
 - 1) "And the things which belong to..."
 - 2) "edify" = οικοδομης = "the process of building a house, the process is incomplete and on going"

- II. Do Not Pursue Things That Destroy verse 20
 - A. "For meat destroy not the work of God"
 - 1) "meat" = $\beta \rho \omega \mu \alpha$ = "whatever is eaten", "solid food"
 - 2) "destroy" = καταλυω = "to loosen down", "to
 disunite the parts of anything"
 - 3) "work" = $\epsilon \rho \gamma \circ v =$ "the thing accomplished by energy"
 - 4) "Do not, for the sake of food, be tearing down God's work" Mon.
 - B. "All things indeed are pure"
 - 1) "pure" = καθαρος = "free from everything that would change or corrupt the nature of the subject"
 - 2) "All food, in the strictest sense, is pure"
 - C. "but it is evil for that man who eateth with offense"
 - "offense" = προσκομμα = "the object that one strikes against and stumbles"
 - 2) "evil" = κακος = "bad of every sort"
 - 3) "But it is wrong for anyone to make others fall by what one eats."
- III. The Ideal Attitude For Them To Pursue verse 21
 - A. "It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine nor any thing."
 - 1) "flesh" = $\kappa \rho \epsilon \alpha \varsigma$ = "dead meat"
 - 2) "wine" = olvog = "the fermented juice of the grape"
 - 3) "We should be willing to be both vegetarians and teetotalers" Phi.
 - B. "...whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak."
 - 1) "stumbleth" = προσκοπτω = "to strike the foot against anything"
 - 2) "whereby thy brother is caused to stumble"

- IV. Pursue A Conscience Made Good By Faith verse 22
 - A. "Hast thou faith? have it to thyself before God"
 - 1) "Do you have faith [that nothing is unclean]?
 - 2) "Keep it for thine own comfort before God" Con.
 - B. "Happy is he that condemneth not himself in that thing which he alloweth."
 - 1) "happy" = μακαριος = "confidently joyous"
 - 2) "condemneth" = κρινω = "to judge"
 - 3) "alloweth" = δοκιμαζω = "to approve of after careful examination"
 - 4) "Happy the person who has no qualms of conscience in what he decides to do in this matter."
 - C. "And he that doubteth is damned if he eat,"
 - "doubteth" = διακρινω = "to be in strife with one's self", "hesitate", "waver"
 - 2) "damned" = κατακρινω = "to give judgment against"
 - 3) "Yet if a man eats meat with an uneasy conscience about it, you may be sure he is wrong to do so."
 - D. "because he eateth not of faith"
 - 1) "For he is not following his convictions"
 - 2) "It was not faith that motivated him to eat"
- E. "for whatsoever is not of faith is sin"
 - "Anything that does not rest on one's convictions is wrong"
 - 2) "When we act apart from our faith we sin"
