## Romans 12:1-2

## INTRODUCTION:

- A. Some important facts we must believe
  - 1) There is a god
  - 2) He has revealed Himself to us
  - 3) He desires our worship
  - 4) He has a right to tell us what pleases Him
  - 5) We should do all things according to His will and not according to our thinking.
- B. Jesus set the boundaries of worship John 4:20-24
  - 1) It would not be confined to a particular place
  - 2) It would be in Spirit
  - 3) It would be in truth
- C. Paul enlarges on the act of worship and informs the Romans of that which constitutes the basis of individual and corporate worship.
  - 1) We must offer ourselves to God
  - 2) We must offer our minds to God
  - 3) This is God's will
- I. Present Your Living Body To God verse 1
  - A. "I beseech you therefore, brethren by the mercies of God,..."
    - "beseech" = παρακαλεω = "to call to", "admonish",
      "encourage" The word was used in classical Greek of
      exhorting troops who were about to go into battle.
    - 2) "therefore" = OUV = This refers to the whole previous argument. vs. 30, 31, 32
    - 3) "mercies" = Οικτιρμος = "mercy, compassion, arising from the miserable\_state of one in need" The prep. w. gen. (hy) gives the reader to understand that the

- B. "...but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind."
  - "transformed" = μεταμορφοομαι = "to change one's form, fashion or appearance, to altar one's form.
  - 2) "renewing" = avakatvwots = "renovation", "making other and different from that which had been formerly"
  - 3) "mind" = voug = "the thinking power"
  - 4) Jesus was "transformed" Mark 9:1-3
- C. "that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God."
  - 1) "prove" =  $\delta o \kappa \iota \mu \alpha \zeta \omega$  = "to assay", "to make trial of", "put to the proof"
  - 2) "good" =  $\alpha\gamma\alpha\theta\alpha\zeta$  = "worthy of admiration", The inner harmonious perfection, which is it's own standard.
  - 3) "acceptable" = ευαρεστος = "well-pleasing"
  - 4) "perfect" = τελειος = "what has reached it's end, term, or limit, hence complete, full, wanting nothing, with special reference to the end for which it was intended"
  - 5) "will" =  $\theta \epsilon \lambda \eta \mu \alpha$  = "active volition", "wish", "desire"
  - 6) "That ye may discern what is the will of God, good and well-pleasing and complete."

- divine mercies are the power by means of which this exhortation should take possession of his will (Godet)
- 4) Motive is important! When we know the power of God's mercies we are to offer worship.
- B. "that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice holy, acceptable unto God,..."
  - "present" = παριστημι = "to cause to stand beside or near, to place nearby, exhibit" The technical term for presenting a sacrifice.
  - 2) "bodies" = σωμα = "the body as a whole" It is the sum total of our person, mind, body, spirit.
  - 3) "living" =  $\zeta \alpha \omega$  = "to have life in all of it's varied aspects, the glory of that which lives"
  - 4) "sacrifice" = θυσια = "the act of killing and offering in sacrifice; it may mean the flesh of the thing killed.
  - 5) "holy" = αγιος = "sacred", "that which is sacred cannot be polluted, purity is part of the meaning"
  - 6) "acceptable" = ευαρεστος = "well-pleasing"
  - 7) "Dedicated and fit for His service" NEB
- C. "which is your reasonable service"
  - "reasonable" = λογικος = "rational", "pertaining to the reason", "intelligent"
  - 2) "service" = λατεια = "worship", "service to God"
  - 3) "Intelligent worship of God"
- II. Restructure Your Thinking verse 2
  - A. "And be not conformed to this world:"
    - "conformed" = συσχηματιζω = "to form, fashion, or shape one thing after or like another"
    - 2) I Peter 1:13-16
    - 3) "Do not let this world mold you into it's shape"
