STRIVING TOGETHER IN PRAYER

Romans 15:30-33

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Paul, like Jesus, was a man of prayer
 - 1) He prayed for the Ephesians
 - 2) He prayed for the Philippians
- B. Paul also realized the importance of having other pray for him.
 - 1) He makes such a request of the Romans vs. 30
 - 2) He knew how fragile he was
- C. We should take seriously these examples
 - 1) Jesus "men ought always to pray and not to faint"
 - 2) Paul "pray without ceasing" II Thess. 5:17
- I. Paul's Request And It's Basis verse 30
 - A. "Now I beseech you, brethren, for the Lord Jesus Christ's sake..."
 - 1) "beseech" = παρακαλω = "to urge", "to encourage"
 - 2) "I appeal urgently to you, brothers"
 - 3) "sake" = $\delta \iota \alpha$ = "on account of"
 - B. "and for the love of the Spirit"
 - 1) "And by the love which the Spirit gives" Con
 - 2) "And by the love which His Spirit inspires" Wey
 - C. "that you strive together with me in your prayers to God for me;"
 - "strive together" = συναγωνιζομαι = "to fight or contend along with someone, wrestling in prayer"
 - 2) "That you agonize with me in prayer to God on my behalf"

- II. The Things They Should Pray For verse 31-32
 - A. "That I may be delivered from them that do not believe in Judaea;" vs. 31
 - "delivered" = ρυομαι = "to draw or snatch to one's self", " to rescue"
 - 2) "do not believe" = $\alpha\pi\epsilon \iota\theta\epsilon\omega$ = "to be disobedient"
 - 3) "That I may be rescued from those in Judaea who are disobedient to the faith"
 - 4) Paul had two areas that caused fear
 - a> The council in Jerusalem
 - b> The brethren who resented his teaching that the Law of Moses was fulfilled.
- B. "and that my service which I have for Jerusalem may be accepted by the saints"
 - 1) "service" = διακονια = "serviceable labour"
 - 2) "accepted" = ευπροσδεκτος = "well received"
 - 3) "And that my ministry for Jerusalem may prove acceptable to the saints" ABUV
 - 4) Paul may have in mind the gift from the Gentiles and his preaching of Christ.
- C. "That I may come unto you with joy by the will of God" vs. 32
 - 1) Paul's coming unto them with joy depended on what happened in Jerusalem.
 - 2) "So that, God willing, I may be able to come to you with a joyful heart."
- D. "any may with you be refreshed"
 - 1) "refreshed" = συναναπαυω = "to refresh one's self or be refreshed in conjunction with anyone, or in his company"
 - 2) "And may be refreshed in your companionship"

- III. Paul's Benediction Upon Them
- verse 32
- A. "Now the God of peace be with you all"
 - 1) "May God the giver of peace..." TENT
 - 2) Paul's universal prayer for the Lord's churches was for them to have peace.
- B. To God's people He is a God of peace
 - 1) He brought Jesus, the Prince of Peace to our world
 - 2) He brought peace to our hearts
 - 3) He wills for the church to, "be at peace"
 - 4) Jesus will bring peace
