## "WE ARE THE LORD'S"

## Romans 14:7-12

## INTRODUCTION:

- A. Paul has written about special diets vs. 2
  - 1) "one believeth that he may eat all things"
  - 2) "another, who is weak, eateth herbs"
- B. Some observe special days vs. 5
  - 1) "one esteemeth one day above another"
  - 2) "another esteemeth every day alike"
- C. The truth about the entire matter
  - 1) If you eat or if you don't eat, do it for the Lord
  - 2) If you observe a day or you don't, do it for the Lord
  - 3) Make sure you give thanks!
- D. These issues will not separate us from Him vs. 7
  - 1) "for none of us liveth to himself"
  - 2) "and no man dieth, dieth to himself"
  - 3) We are never alone! He is with us!
- I. We Are The Lord's verse 8
  - A. "For whether we live, we live unto the Lord;"
    - 1) "while we live" Knox
    - 2) "Our life is for the Master" TENT
  - B. "and whether we die, we die unto the Lord:"
    - 1) "when we die" Knox
    - 2) "Our death is for the Master" TENT
  - C. "whether we live therefore, or die, we are the Lord's"
    - 1) "In life and in death, we belong to the Lord" Knox
    - 2) "Once His, we are always His"

- II. We Are The Lord's, He Died And Rose Again For Us Verse 9
  - A. "But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother?"
    - 1) "But you, why do you find fault with your brother?"
    - 2) "And you, why do you hold your brother in contempt?"
  - B. "for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ"
    - 1) "stand" = παριστημι = "to cause to stand near"
    - 2) "judgment seat" = "a step", "a raised place"
    - 3) This word,  $\beta\eta\mu\alpha$ , is used in *Acts 25:6, 10, 17* to describe the place where Festus sat in Caesarea to judge Paul.
    - 4) "All of us will have to stand before the tribunal of God." Mof.
  - C. "For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me," vs. 11
    - 1) "For scripture says" TENT
    - 2) "As surely as I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me." GSPD
    - 3) "bow" = καμπτω = "to bend", "to curve", "used of the knee in worship or prayer"
  - D. "and every tongue shall confess to God"
    - 1) "and every tongue shall acknowledge God"
    - 2) "confess" = εξομολογεω = "to speak out the same things with another", "to speak the same language", "to say the same things", "to concede", "to admit"
- E. The event as seen by Isaiah
  - 1) Isaiah 45:20-25
  - 2) This is a done deal!

- IV. The Fact We Must Accept verse 12
  - A. "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God."
    - 1) "account" =  $\lambda \circ \gamma \circ \varsigma$  = "the word", "the speaking" An exposition which one gives.
    - 2) "Each of us then will have to answer for himself to God"
  - B. Remember, Paul is talking about our own personal lifestyle
    - We had better be sure vs. 5 "...let every man be fully persuaded in his own mind."
    - 2) This should end judging vs. 13
