THE HOPE IN JESUS CHRIST Romans 8:24-27

INTRODUCTION:

- A. The creation was subjected to the bondage of sin by God.
 - 1) Vs. 20
 - The creation will be liberated when the sons of God are glorified. This will be during the Millenial Kingdom.
 - 3) Vs. 21
- B. Until the time of "liberty" the entire universe longs for it to occur. vs. 22
 - 1) "groaneth" = stenazo = "to sigh", "long for"
 - 2) "travaileth" = sunodino = "childbirth", "jointly"
- C. God's people also long for this coming kingdom, in fact we pray for it!
 - 1) Vs. 23
 - 2) It will effect body resurrection
- D. This time of liberation is the object of our hope.
 - 1) It is not the "blessed hope", the second coming.
 - 2) They are interwoven.
- I. This Hope Sustains Us

Vs. 24 - 25

- A. "For we are saved by hope:"
 - 1) "saved" = sozo = "to make sound", "to save, "to preserve safe from danger, loss or destruction"
 - 2) "hope" = te elpidi = "in hope" = elpis = "the expectation of something future." A well-grounded expectation and a gladly and firmly held prospect of a future good.
 - 3) We are kept and sustained in all of our trials by this hope of that which is to be.
- B. "but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?"
 - 1) "seen" = belpo = "to use the eyes", "to observe"
 - 2) "Hope would not be hope if its objects were in view, for we could not hope for what we are looking at with our own eyes."
 - 3) We are not at this time delivered from the bondage of sin, not man, not creation but we firmly expect to be!
- C. "But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it." vs. 25
 - 1) "see not" = ou blepomen = "we do not see"
 - 2) "patience" = upomone = "a remaining under"
 - 3) "wait" = apekdechomai = "to wait out", "wait long for"

- 4) "We steadfastly endure the present, and long earnestly for the future"
- 5) This makes little sense to fat, lazy, saints who endure little and resent the least suffering!

II. The Holy Spirit Helps Us To Have Hope

- A. This is one of the remaining gifts
 - 1) I Corinthians 13:13 "And now abideth..."
 - 2) "faith, hope and love"
- B. "Likewise the Spirit also helps our infirmities" vs. 26
 - 1) "likewise" = osautos = "in the same way"
 - 2) "helps" = sunantilambano = "to lay hold of a thing together with a person and so to assist that person"
 - 3) "infirmities" = astheneia = "want of strength",
 "weakness", "feebleness"
 - 4) "In the selfsame manner", refers to vs. 22. It is the Spirit helping the creation to articulate its pain that is called a "groaning", it is the sighing of God's creation to be set free from its bondage to sin.
- C. "for we know not what we should pray for as we ought:"
 - 1) "ought" = dei = "it needs", "there is need of something that is absent or wanting", "it is necessary"
 - 2) "for we do not know what and how we ought to pray"
 - 3) Just as creation needs aid and help from the Spirit in its sighs for liberty so does the believer. The believer does not comprehend the full understanding of this event.
- D. "but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered."
 - 1) "intercession" = uperentugchano = "to plead or intercede on behalf of someone" The Good Samaritan made intercession for the man who was robbed.
 - 2) "groanings" = stenagmos = "a sighing, as of one distressed", "sighs and groans are methods of communication"
 - 3) "uttered" = alaletos = "not to be expressed in words"
 - 4) The copy machine repair man.

III. Our Communication with God is Spirit to Spirit

- A. This is a truth Jesus taught.
 - 1) John 4:24 "God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth."
 - 2) It is never in the flesh Romans 8:6
 - 3) It is flesh to flesh and spirit to spirit

- B. "And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the spirit,"
 - 1) "searcheth" = ereunao = "to seek out", "to trace"
 It is used to describe dogs tracing their game by
 the foot.
 - 2) God searches the human heart
 - 3) "mind" = phronema = "what one has in mind, what one thinks and feels"
 - 4) Luke 9:47 "And Jesus, perceiving the thought of their heart....", "which of them should be the greatest"
 - 5) Matthew 5:27-28 = committed adultery....in his heart
- C. "because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God"
 - 1) "intercession" = entugchano = "to fall in with", "to meet and talk with"
 - 2) "because the Holy Spirit helps the saints according to God, (what God plans)"
 - 3) There is no special language wherein men pray, "in the Spirit", that is in a special tongue.
 - 4) The language of the Spirit is to you and to me, English!
