    - doulos = servant. A slave, to stand in relationship of a slave.
    - 2. Greeks found personal dignity in the fact of his freedom. Did not desire to be in bondage of will.
    - 3. Service is not repudiated. The Greek city-state depended upon the service of citizens, they gave it with all their powers, even to life itself.

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- 4. Service of a doulos, has no possibility of evading the tasks laid upon him, he has no personal choice, he must do what another will have done, refrain from doing what another will not have done.
