The Temptation Of Jesus - Part 2

Matthew 4:5-7

Intro:

- A. Jesus has been led by the Spirit into the wilderness.
 - 1. He has been publicly identified as Messiah.
 - 2. He is to be tested by Satan.
- B. The first temptation had to do with priorities.
 V.3
 - 1. "If thou be the Son of God"
 - 2. "turn these stones to bread"
 - 3. Jesus answered, vs.4, he knew that men do not live because they eat bread only but they must obey the commandments that issue from God's mouth.
- I. Jesus And Sensationalism.
 - A. "Then the devil taketh him up into the holy city, and setteth him on a pinnacle of the temple."
 - 1. setteth = $\iota \sigma \tau \eta \mu \iota$ = "to cause to stand"

 - 3. "...and had Him stand on the tip-top turret
 of the temple." Wms.
 - B. The temptation. V.6
 - 1. "If thou be the Son of God"
 - 2. $\frac{\text{cast}}{\text{down}''} = \beta \alpha \lambda \lambda \omega = \text{``to fall down''}, \text{``to cast}$
 - 3. "He shall give his angels charge concerning thee.
 - 4. <u>charge</u> = εντελλομαι = "to enjoin upon," "to charge with", "to command".
 - 5. "He has commanded His angels to look after you" Nor
 - C. "...and in their hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone."
 - 1. dash = προσκοπτω = "to strike against:"

- 2. "So that you may never strike your foot against a stone." NEB
- 3. "And they will lift you up with their hands." Gspd

D. The Old Testament Scriptures.

- 1. Psalm 91:9-13
- 2. The problem of incorrect interpretation.
- 3. Incorrect Bible interpretation is the reason for most heresy and unscriptural groups.
- It is true that you can prove or approve anything you want to do by twisting the scriptures.
- 5. This was not a promise to be used to prove God!

II. The Reply Of Jesus.

A. "Jesus said unto him, It is written again..." v.7

- 1. written = $\gamma \rho \alpha \phi \omega$ = to grave or cut
- 2. "yes, retorted Jesus, and Scripture also
 says" Phi

B. "thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God."

- 1. $\frac{\text{tempt}}{\text{thoroughly"}} = \frac{\text{ekpeira}}{\text{to try out," "try thoroughly"}}$
- 2. To tempt God is to put God in a bind or a dilemma so that He has to do what one wants.
- 3. God doesn't want you to test Him!
- 4. Tithing was a command to the Jews. It was an act of obedience that God had covenanted to bless. Malachi 3:8-11
- 5. We are not under this covenant. We are as Jesus was. Our faith is seen in our obedience to God in suffering. Joshua 23:10 "one man of you shall chase a thousand."

C. The Old Testament Scripture.

- 1. Deuteronomy 6:16
- 2. The Israelites tempted God. They were thirsty and they questioned God's plan for them. God had a plan. He would have provided. Exodus 17:1-7

- 3. The same occurred 40 years later. Numbers 20:1-11. This time it is Merebah. Massah and Merebah, Exodus 17:7 Massah = "proving", Merebah = "strife." We do not, we must not prove God. We must trust God. People don't love God who put him to the test, they are said to "hate" Him! Psalm 81:10-16 (walked in their own counsel) v.15
- 4. Jesus did not intend to make the mistake of Israel or Moses!
- D. Paul used it as a warning to the churches.
 - 1. Hebrews 3:7-12
 - 2. Don't test God, trust God.
