I Peter 1:2

- A. There are two great goals in life.
 - 1. To obtain salvation.
 - 2. To be very happy.
 - 3. Why do some want to be saved.
 - a. Save marriage.
 - b. Better daddy.
 - c. Get off drugs.
 - d. Out of debt.
- B. These "scattered one's" had both.
 - 1. How did they come to possess them?
 - 2. Later verses tell of persecution.

I. "ELECT, ACCORDING TO THE FOREKNOWLEDGE OF GOD."

- A. What does God know?
 - 1. Omnipresent,
 - 2. Omnipotent.
 - 3. Omniscient.
 - 4. God knows the end from the beginning.
- b. Does the foreknowledge of God pre-destinate?
 - If God knows all, then all He knows must come to pass.
 - 2. Does God Know we will sin? Then God is the author of sin! NO!
- C. God knows the future as we know the past.
 - 1. My knowledge of John F. Kennedy and Dallas, Texas.
- D. Who are these people? They are saved people, therefore they are "elect."

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 God has elected to save all who accept His plan, and all who accept His plan are elected.

II. "THROUGH SANCTIFICATION OF THE SPIRIT."

- A. Sanctification = set apart, the beginning and end of salvation is by the Spirit.
 - 1. The troubling of the water, the calming of water.
- b. To ignore the work of the Holy Spirit is to bring disaster to the church and to all His people.

"OBEDIENT TO JESUS CHRIST."

- A. obedient = a hearing attentively, or listening, hence, obedience as the result of attentive hearing.
 - Jesus said, "He that hath ears to hear, let him hear."
- B. If we are not obedient we are disobedient.
 - "I have not done what the Bible teachers but I am not doing wrong."
 - Either in His will or in rebellion.
 - a. If ye know His will.

"AND SPRINKLED IN HIS BLOOD."

- A. The Bible emphasizes his blood.
 - 1. Adam and Eve. garments.
 - 2. Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.
 - 3. O.T. sacrifices.
 - 4. The Passover.
 - 5. His own blood.

"GRACE AND PEACE BE MULTIPLIED"

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- A. Amp. "May grace (spiritual blessing) and peace be given you in increasing abundance, that spiritual peace to be realized in and through Jesus Christ; freedom from: fears, agitating passions and moral conflicts."
 - grace = a kind, affectionate, pleasing nature, friendly willingness, pleasing work, kindness favor; on the part of the receiver, thanks.
 - 2. peace = peace, rest; in contrast with strife, and denoting the absence or end of strife. A state of untroubled, undisturbed well being. The peace which is the result of forgiveness enjoyed. This is not "peace with God."
 - 3. This the peace the church was to have.
 - 4. Sowing discord and strife is a sin!
- B. There are three dimensions to peace.
 - 1. Peace with God. Eph. 2:14.
 - 2. Peace with self. Phil. 4:4-7.
 - 3. Peace with others. I Peter 3:10-11.
