Introduction:

- A. The Christian is unique among religions.
 - 1. The plan of salvation.
 - By grace, plus nothing, minus nothing.
 - 3. It is the gift of God.
- B. All other religions and many Christian denominations teach self-deliverance.
 - 1. They have sacred places, sacred acts, sacred people.
 - 2. In true Christianity, there is a sacred person, Jesus!
- C. How can God give us salvation?
 - 1. What is the basis of forgiveness?
 - 2. Eph 4:32 "And be ye kind one to another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you."
- D. The suffering Christ, the shed blood is the ground upon which we stand.
 - 1. Why as I saved. The blood of Jesus.
 - 2. Why will I never be forsaken? The Blood of Jesus.
 - 3. Why will I go to heaven? The Blood of Jesus.
 - 4. Why is it all taken care of? The Blood of Jesus.
- I. WE SHOULD NOT EXPECT TO LIVE WITHOUT SUFFERING. V21
 - A. "for even hereunto were ye called."
 - 1. This is a part of our calling.
 - 2. "to such an experience you have been called."
 - B. "because Christ also suffered for us."
 - 1. We cannot deny this.
 - 2. suffered = to be affected by anything from without
 - C. "leaving us an example, that ye should follow His steps"

- 1. us = this is for saved people.
- example = a writing copy, hence a pattern.
- steps = a footstep.

II. JESUS WAS WITHOUT SIN. V22

- A. "who did no sin."
 - 1. He did no wrong.
 - Nothing deceitful ever found on His lips.
- B. "neither was guile found in His mouth."
 - 1. No wicked insinuations.
 - 2. No hidden traps, no enticing words.

III. JESUS DID NOT PUNISH HIS TORMENTORS. V23

- A. "who when he was reviled, reviled not again."
 - reviled = to rail at, verbal abuse.
 - 2. When insulted he offered none in return.
- B. "when he suffered, he threatened not."
 - 1. threatened = to hold out promises.
 - 2. Did not allow others to take up His cause.
- C. "but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously"
 - 1. Committed His cause to Him (God).
 - 2. God will judge the lost who make His people suffer.
 - 3. What else can we do? I Cor. 5:11-13.

IV. JESUS, IN SO DOING BECAME OUR SIN BEARER. V24

- A. "who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree."
 - "He carried the burden of our sins in His own body."
 - Jesus became the Anti-type of the O.T. type of transfer of guilt.

- B. "that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness:"
 - "that we might cease to live for sin and live the good life."
 - 2. Eph. 2:8-9.
- C. "by whose stripes ye were healed."
 - 1. "It was the suffering that He bore that has healed you."

V. WHAT WE WERE AND WHAT WE ARE. V25

- A. "For ye were as sheep going astray."
 - 1. "for ye were continually straying like sheep."
- B. "but are now returned unto the shepherd and Bishop of your souls."
 - "now you have returned to your Shepherd, the guardian who keeps you safe from all attacks."
