 - 1. This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I stir up your pure minds, by way of remembrance.
 - stir = diegeipw = to wake up fully, to rouse; excite, incite.
 - pure = eilikpivns = judged of in the sunlight, and so found to be genuine; hence unmixed, pure.
 - Remembrance = hinting, suggesting.
- B. These people had memories of a divine nature.
 - 1. They had been told the truth.
 - 2. They had been saved.
 - They had been baptized.
 - 4. They had been scattered.
 - 5. They had been persecuted.
 - 6. They had a tendency to forget.
- C. They were to think about two things.
 - 1. They had "sunshine minds."
 - 2. They could be taught.
